Message

I am happy to know that the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) is organizing its Annual General Meeting (AGM) 2021-2022 in Dhaka.

The Greatest Bangalee of all time, Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman rebuilt the war-ravaged country in just three and a half years. For economic development of Bangladesh, he formulated a Five-Year Plan. Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib turned the war-ravaged Bangladesh into a Least Developed Country (LDC). The GDP growth rate exceeded 9 percent.

Awami League government has emphasized the role of the private sector in our socio-economic development. Bangladesh offers its large domestic markets, strategic location, high profitability, demographic dividend and conducive policy incentives that rendered the country as one of the most preferred investment destinations in the world. These have fostered increased private investments and yielded significant rise in both local and Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in the recent years. Bangladesh saw exports growth more than 34 percent to USD 52.08b in the FY 2021-2022 from USD 15.6b in the FY 2008-2009. The country's imports also rose from USD 22.5b in FY 2008-2009 to USD 89.16b in FY 2020-2021. The private investment reached 24.06 percent of the total GDP in the FY 2021-2022.

I acknowledge the supportive role of FBCCI in our efforts to achieve development goals, expand trade and commerce in the country, and expedite overall economic progress. I hope that the FBCCI will play a proactive role in bringing more local and foreign investors in the country, and in building a hunger-poverty-free prosperous-developed Bangladesh by 2041 as dreamt by the Father of the Nation.

I wish the FBCCI Annual General Meeting a grand success.

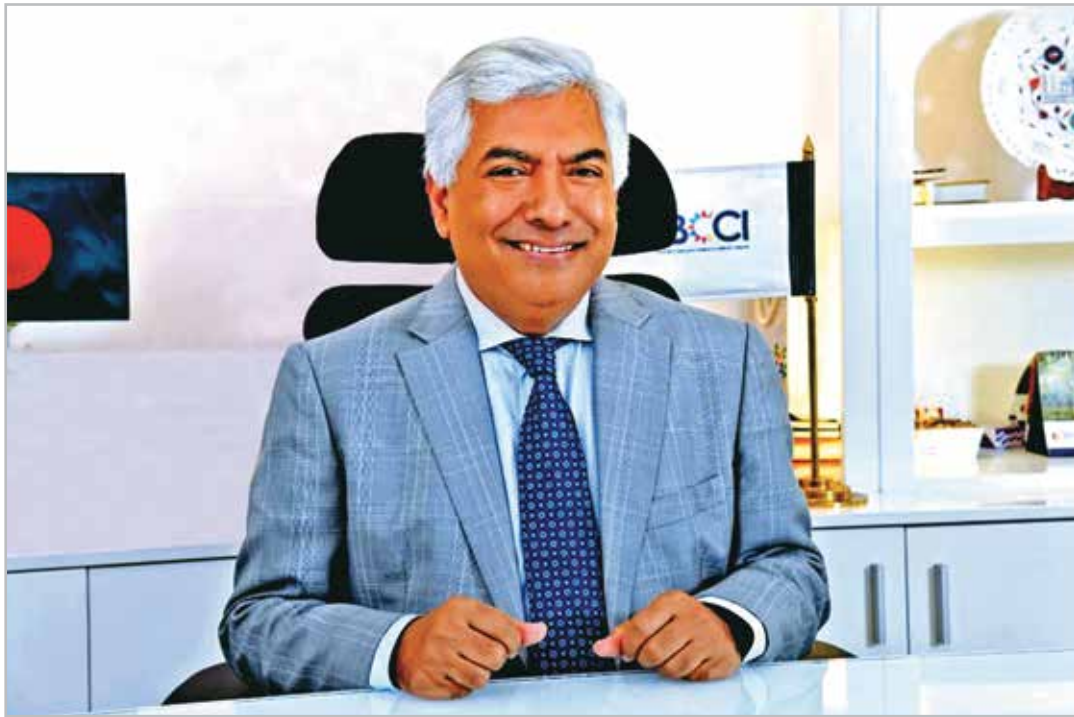

It is my honour and humble privilege to welcome you all to the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the present Board of Directors of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI).

As required by the Companies Act and the Articles of Association of FBCCI, we are all congregated here to take account the FBCCI activities and proceedings of the year 2021-2022.

The agenda of today's AGM include the conduct of business of the FBCCI, Minutes of the last AGM, Report of FBCCI's line of activities for the year, Audited Accounts, etc. which has been compiled together to form the Annual Report.

From the Board of the Directors, we extend our thanks and gratitude to the General Body Members of the FBCCI for their presence and participation in the AGM. We believe that your presence today has given us a special opportunity to receive meaningful advice and feedback to strengthen our organization.

At the outset, I would like to express our deep regret at the sad demise of some vital Members of the FBCCI family. We pray to Almighty Allah for granting their departed soul's peace and high place in heaven. We fondly recall their meaningful and important contributions towards FBCCI and business sector development.

As you are aware, the present Board of Directors of FBCCI started their journey on May 19, 2021 with a vision for pursuing a number of important goals. At the outset of our voyage, we adopted a plan for 100 days of fast-track initiatives. The Board members including the Senior Vice President and the Vice Presidents has been performing their duties in a commendable manner. I thank my fellow colleagues and the Board of Directors for shouldering their responsibilities wholeheartedly while executing our plans and programs successfully and carrying those forwards in a dynamic manner. I believe that together with so many of your brilliant minds and your valuable contribution, we are moving in the right direction towards of our future activities.

For FBCCI, the Most Notable Events of the Year 2022:

'Members' Night' of FBCCI

FBCCI organized the Members' Night-2022 in honour of general body members at the International Convention City of Bashundhara, Dhaka on July 2, 2022. On behalf of the Board we applauded former Presidents, First & Senior Vice President, and Vice Presidents for their contributions to FBCCI and the country's economy through prudent leadership.

Among the former Presidents, Salman F. Rahman, M A Sattar, Mahbubur Rahman, Mir Nasir Hossain, A.K. Azad, Abdul Matlub Ahmad, Sheikh Fazle Fahim were present at the programme. They expressed their views and recalled their memories during their tenures at FBCCI. FBCCI's 50 years' logo and 'FBCCI YEARBOOK 2022' highlighting the activities of the first year of the current board were also unveiled during the event.

Inauguration of Mujib Corner

To uphold the spirit and philosophy of the father of the nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the present board of the FBCCI set up Mujib Corner at FBCCI. A lounge for FBCCI Directors has been set up next to Mujib Corner. Dr. Hasan Mahmud MP, Hon'ble Minister of Information and Broadcasting as the Chief Guest inaugurated the Mujib Corner.

FBCCI Delegation Visited India as entourage of Hon'ble Prime Minister

A high-level business delegation led by President FBCCI undertook a 4-day visit to India from September 5 to September 8, 2022 as entourage of Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina. During the visit, the delegation participated in a number of meetings and seminars along with top business leaders and chambers of India.

FBCCI Delegation Visited UK and USA as entourage of Hon'ble Prime Minister

A high-level business delegation led by the FBCCI President visited the UK and USA as entourage members of Honourable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina during September 20-28, 2022. During the US visit, the delegation attended the 77th UN General Assembly session in New York. The delegation members also attended a number of events to promote bilateral trade and investment.

FBCCI has signed a MoU with Greater New York Chamber of Commerce and Industry with a view to facilitating mainstream trade and investment between Bangladesh and the USA. The signing ceremony took place during a seminar titled 'Bangabandhu's Vision and Bangladeshi Immigrant Day' held on September 25, 2022 in New York, USA.

US-Bangladesh Business Summit and MoU signed with US-Bangladesh Business Council

FBCCI hosted the largest and historic business delegation from the United States to have come to Dhaka and organized US-Bangladesh Business Summit jointly with US-BBC on May 09, 2022. Hon. Commerce Minister Mr. Tipu Munshi, MP as the Chief Guest attended the summit and called US companies for investing in Bangladesh. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between the FBCCI and the US-Bangladesh Business Council to enhance bilateral trade at the first U.S.-Bangladesh Business Summit.

FBCCI Delegation visited UK to attend the Commonwealth Trade & Investment Summit in London.

FBCCI Business Delegation led by President of FBCCI visited UK during December 4-9, 2022 to attend the Commonwealth Trade & Investment Summit held in London.

My Dear General Body Members,

The true output of our efforts and contribution as the private sector is reflected in our macro-economic performance and national budget. Therefore, I would like to very briefly remark on these two issues.

Macro-Economic Performance of Bangladesh

During the pandemic, following the guidance of our visionary and most dynamic Prime Minister's declaration of comprehensive stimulus packages and the active role of private sector, Bangladesh continued a positive economic growth of 7.2 % in FY 2022. We have achieved 34.38% export growth worth of US\$ 52.08 bn in FY 2021-22. Imports grew by 35.93% standing at US\$ 89.16 bn.

In the global context, the present year is marked for the recovery of the worsening situation of global economy due to adverse effect of COVID 19 pandemic and uncertain situation for ongoing Russia Ukraine war. For Bangladesh the post-Covid pandemic situation and the Ukraine crisis have resulted in massive price hikes across all sectors, including food, industrial raw materials and production inputs, overall transport costs and abnormally high currency exchange rates, all of which have increased the cost of doing business.

In addition to increasing cost of production, global demand in the export sector has decreased and prices have risen, making it a challenge for us to survive in global competition. So, like other countries in the world, we have faced the decreasing trends of our major economic indicators. But from our point of view, production and export activities cannot be disturbed in any way.

For stability in economy, special attention must be paid to the manufacturing and agricultural sectors. Unnecessary expenditure and import of luxury goods should be reduced. However, excessive import controls of industrial raw materials/equipment and essential commodities will disturb production and may also increase inflation. Efforts should be made to eliminate wastage in the power and water sector — with the aim of sustainable development of the sector.

To achieve the targets for export diversification, employment generation, increasing investment and FDI we need more concentration on the development of our existing logistics infrastructure.

We believe that integration to global supply chain, adaptation of circular economy concept, formulation of waste management policy, Port development initiatives and automation, fulfill the rising demand for hundred economic zones, multimodal transport strategies and massive infrastructure development projects will contribute towards sustaining our graduation.

For that the quality of growth should be enhanced by taking balanced trade policies and making reforms to tariff structure. Consideration needs to be taken on the long-term negative impact of natural calamities and global economic instability in preparing trade policies.

Budget of FY 2022-23:

Government declared National Budget of Tk. 6,78,068 crore for the fiscal year 2022-23 which was around 12.32% bigger from the revised Budget of fiscal year 2020-21. The GDP growth was targeted 7.5% and bringing down the inflation rate to below 5.6%. The Budget was adopted in the National Parliament on June 09 with some changes to the tax-duty and Value Added Tax (VAT) proposals and aiming at higher growth, lower inflation, lower interest rate, stable exchange rate and gearing up investment.

The revenue receipt for FY 2022-23 is estimated at Tk. 4,33,000 crore (9.7% of GDP). NBR tax revenue is estimated at Tk 3,70,000 crore (8.3% of GDP). The revenue collection target from non-NBR sources has been set at Tk. 18,000 crore (0.4% of GDP). The non-tax revenue collection target has been set at Tk. 45,000 crore (1.01% of GDP). Total expenditure for FY 2021-22 has been estimated at Tk. 6,78,064 crore (15.2% of GDP).

The ADP size has been fixed at Tk. 2,59,617 crore (5.8% of GDP) including allocation for projects to be implemented through self-finance of autonomous bodies. ADP allocations have been estimated giving priority to enhancing regional capacity, developing human resources and overall agriculture and rural development, ensuring power & energy, infrastructure, transport sector and other social security. Budget deficit for the next year is estimated to Tk. 2,45,064 crore, which is 5.5% of GDP.

Reactions of FBCCI on proposed budget for 2022-2023

As an instant reaction on the proposed budget for the FY 2022-2023, from FBCCI we have given our positive response to the Government to prepare a business-friendly budget, as it has addressed the challenges of post-pandemic economy and devised additional pro-people measures. We also praised the target of keeping the inflation rate within 5.6%.

FBCCI termed the proposed national budget as development and welfare oriented during a press conference. We thanked the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for a development-friendly budget amid a volatile global situation and to navigate the country towards development and prosperity on the national budget for FY 2022-23.

FBCCI Board urged the government to abolish the AIT, AT and Source Tax imposed in the proposed budget as the federation felt that commendable reduction in corporate tax would not yield benefits due to AIT, AT and Source Tax. As the proposed budget kept the tax-free income unchanged, the FBCCI called for raising the tax-free income level to Taka 4 lac from the existing Taka 3 lac.

FBCCI Board welcomed the proposal for imposing same tax structure on all export-oriented sectors, 5% VAT on all types of restaurants, withdrawal of AT on imported machineries and parts for Poultry farms, reducing import duty on poultry feed, 50% VAT reduction on manmade fibre, 2% reduction of import duty on HR Coil and Zinc Alloy. FBCCI believed the proposed budget would become more business-friendly, pro-investment and pro-revenue at the press conference.

Important Events and Activities of FBCCI:

Dear colleagues,

With a note of optimism, I am happy to state that we have spent a notable and successful year since the last AGM in December, 2021. All of your consistent support and diligent contributions in the various activities of the FBCCI have been a source of inspiration and guidance for the FBCCI Board in reaching some of our successes. We look forward to your deliberations & recommendations which will help us in the board to steer our programs, decisions and activities in right direction in the year ahead.

Presentation of recommendations / proposals to concerned Government Ministries / Organizations for removal of problems and impediments to trade, commerce and industry;

We have submitted various recommendations and proposals to different Ministries, Bangladesh Bank, NBR, and other relevant authorities addressing & mitigating the different problems and impediments that the business community faced in order to facilitate trade, commerce and industrial activities.

I personally met as well as wrote letters to the Secretaries of different Ministries including Prime Minister's office, and the Chairmen of sectoral corporations like Bangladesh Investment Development Authority, Bangladesh Economic Zones Authority, for solving the problems that were prevalent. We have also attended a number of meetings on different issues related to trade, economy, development of private sector, etc, chaired by Hon'ble Prime Minister and other concerned Ministers. We also met with the Governor of Bangladesh Bank. Issues regarding interest rate, non-performing loan, access to finance of SMEs etc were discussed in the meeting.

We have also organized a number of discussion meetings with the Hon'ble Ministers for Finance, Planning, Commerce, Industries, Information and Broadcasting, Advisor to the Hon'ble Prime Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources, Adviser to Honorable Prime Minister for the Private Sector Industry and Investment, NBR Chairman through which we have been able to highlight our issues and have called for their intervention and support to the business community as appropriately required. The Heads and representatives of the member bodies have also taken the initiative to interact directly with the Ministers in these meetings.

We have also utilized various forums, seminars, conferences, roundtables, etc. organized by other organizations to present our views and suggestions concerning the business community.

Discussion Meetings/Interactions with High Profile Foreign Delegations and Heads of Foreign Missions:

At present time of globalization and increasing international linkages, FBCCI took the initiative of joining fairs, conference and many rounds of discussion meetings and B2B meetings held in different countries in the world. In this regard FBCCI President, Senior Vice President and Vice presidents led various business delegations and attended business events and fairs and signed MoUs with its counterparts and other trade development organizations of different countries and states which are or could be important trade partners of Bangladesh including Dubai, Morocco, USA, FBCCI, Geneva, Brazil, North East India, Indonesia and UK.

FBCCI also took the initiative of organizing many rounds of discussion meetings and B2B meetings with Foreign Delegations with a view to engage in more trade, investment and successful business partnerships in Bangladesh.

The visiting delegations were also led by the Presidents, Ministers and High Dignitaries of different countries. FBCCI Standing Committees:

We have formed 78 Standing Committees in FBCCI to rightly reflect FBCCI’s role in the affairs of the business community with the recommendations from concerned stakeholders. A notable number of meetings have been arranged through these committees to address the sectoral issues and problems which need to be solved. Some of the recommendations have already been sent to the relevant ministries for taking necessary actions.

Strengthening of FBCCI Secretariat:

A number of Officials have been recruited to further strengthen the capacity of the FBCCI Secretariat to meet up the demand of the private sector.

FBCCI Panel of Advisors:

FBCCI formulated its Panel of Advisors consisting of 20 members of expertise in different sectors of retired government senior officials, researchers and academia for strengthening private sector voice to the advocacy level.

Policy Advocacy Activities of FBCCI 2021-22:

From FBCCI we are regularly conducting advocacy with the government on different fiscal, monetary and other policy issues for enabling ease of doing business and smooth implementation of government initiatives. The followings are some important issues among others:

Notable Policy Advocacy Achievement:

- Government Implemented the FBCCI's recommendation to adopt similar policy support for all export sectors.
- Exit facility for Non-RMG default sick industry
- Bank classification facility until December, 2022 due to adverse impact of COVID-19 pandemic and Ukraine-Russia war.

Activities of FBCCI Safety Council:

FBCCI for the first time has established a Safety Council considering some recent fire incidents in different industries and to catch up with the prevailing dynamic concept of PMO involving private commercial and industrial sectors with the Govt agencies in safety-related issues. After its establishment, it has started working with the National Committee for Industrial Safety and BIDA in carrying out joint inspection cum survey of non-garment sectors and by now 5200 factories have already been surveyed.

On the other hand, FBCCI has signed an agreement with ILO to enhance occupational safety and health in the 4 selected chambers and 12 sectorial associations. Under this program 16 safety cells have been established. Through these safety cells, some 100 safety committees will be established in different factories, and 900 members of the safety committees' will be trained besides, 2400 representatives of safety units will be on fire safety, rescue, and first aid. The program is to comply with the 'National Plan of Action based on 'The National OSH Profile' and 'National OSH Policy' of the government and to promote a sustainable and safe workplace ensuring the well-being of both workers and entrepreneurs.

Notable CSR Activities of the year 2022:

- As a part of CSR activities, to enable underprivileged women access higher education an MoU was signed between FBCCI and the Asian University for Women (AUW) to award scholarships to 30 female students of this University per year for higher education. The MoU will remain effective initially for 5 years. This initiative would promote women's empowerment and their participation in the country's development process.
- FBCCI distributed blankets in the capital to alleviate the winter sufferings of low-income people. FBCCI President distributed blankets among the cold-stricken people at Islambagh Eidgah ground in Old Dhaka and at the playground of Dhaka Polytechnic Institute in Tejgaon.
- FBCCI distributed relief to the flood-affected people in Sylhet and Sunamganj. The relief includes Chira, Molasses and other dry foods, salt, mineral water, oral saline, candles, and matches.

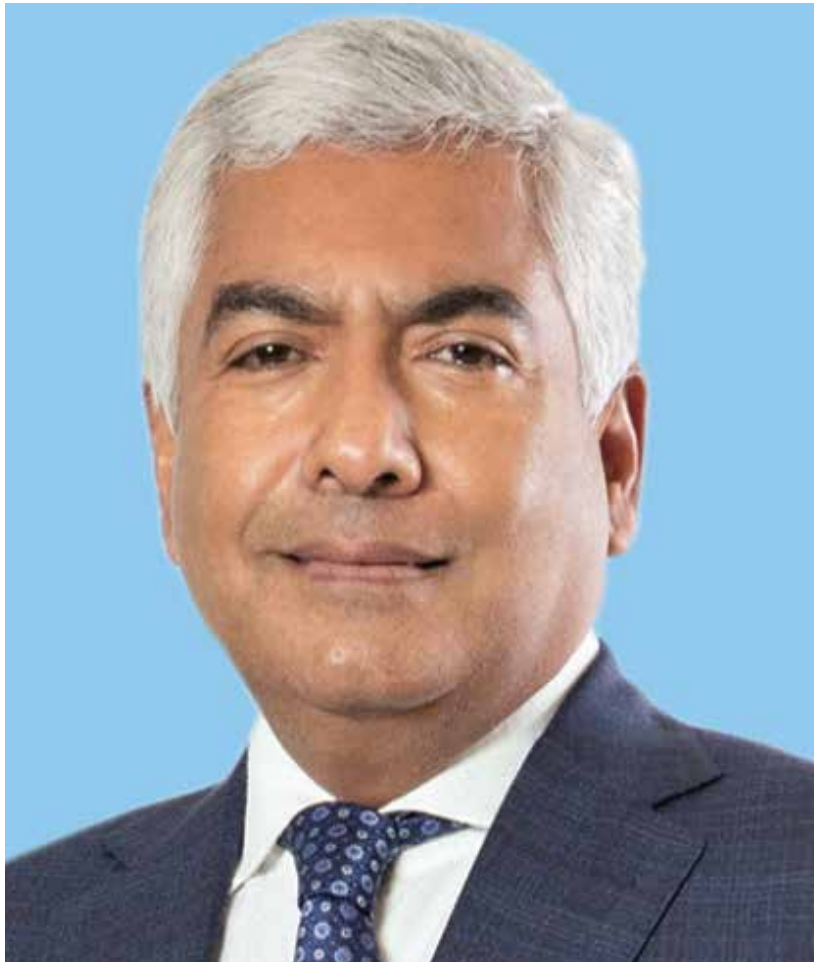

He said that the Government has tried to prepare a business-friendly budget, as it has addressed the challenges of post-pandemic economy and devised additional pro-people measures. He praised the target of keeping the inflation rate within 5.6%.

FBCCI Press Conference on National Budget 2022-23



FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin has termed the proposed national budget as development and welfare oriented during a press conference held at FBCCI on June 11, 2022. He thanked the Honourable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for a development-friendly budget amid a volatile global situation at the press conference organized by FBCCI on the proposed national budget for FY 2022-23.

He also commended the Finance Minister A H M Mustafa Kamal FCA MP for proposing the budget that aimed to navigate the country towards development and prosperity.

However, the FBCCI Chief urged the government to abolish the AIT, AT and Source Tax imposed in the proposed budget as the federation felt that commendable reduction in corporate tax would not yield benefits due to AIT, AT and Source Tax.

The apex trade body also urged the finance minister to withdraw the proposed 15% VAT on laptop, 1% duty on Solar Panel at import stage, waive the VAT on Covid-19 test kits, PPP, plastic face shields and masks, and to restore 10% source tax on Company deposits in banks instead of the proposed 20%.

As the proposed budget kept the tax-free income unchanged, the FBCCI called for raising the tax-free income level to Taka 4 lac from the existing Taka 3 lac.

The FBCCI Chief welcomed the proposal for imposing same tax structure on all export-oriented sectors, 5% VAT on all types of restaurants, withdrawal of AT on imported machineries and parts for Poultry farms, reducing import duty on poultry feed, 50% VAT reduction on manmade fibre, 2% reduction of import duty on HR Coil and Zinc Alloy.

FBCCI believed the proposed budget would become more business-friendly, pro-investment and pro-revenue if the budget accommodated the recommendations made by it at the press conference.

Discussion Meeting with Eswatini delegation

Bangladesh can exploit the almost untapped market of Africa worth \$1.3 billion by expanding business ties in Eswatini (former Swaziland). This was claimed by the Minister for Commerce, Trade and Industry of Eswatini Senator Manqoba Khumalo at a discussion meeting with FBCCI held on July 19, 2022 when he led his country's delegation. He called for strengthening business relations between the two countries.



“With its strategic geographical location, Eswatini acts as a gateway to the African continent”, the minister added. Establishing business and investment relations with Eswatini would provide favourable market access to regional blocs in Africa as the country is a member of Southern African Development Community (SADC) and Southern African Customs Union (SACU), the minister noted.

Highlighting Tax and Duty-Free facilities and other incentives for foreign investors, Senator Manqoba Khumalo informed that Bangladesh may treat Eswatini as a potential market especially for exporting readymade garments, agro-products, ICT and electronic goods.

Vice President Md. Amin Helaly assured to provide all kinds of support from FBCCI to increase bilateral trade.

Discussion meeting with Kenyan delegation



A discussion meeting was held between the FBCCI and the visiting delegation of Kenya on July 25 at FBCCI Office. Director General of Bilateral and Political Affairs Ambassador Moi Lemoshira led the Kenyan delegation that showed keen interest to enhance trade relations with Bangladesh.

Ambassador Moi Lemoshira informed during the meeting that Nairobi would soon launch a High Commission in Dhaka; discussion between Bangladesh Biman and Kenya Airways was also underway to establish direct flight.

Kenya seeks Bangladeshi investment in food processing, skills development, healthcare, real-estate, ICT and manufacturing sectors, the Ambassador informed.

The FBCCI Senior Vice President said that establishing trade ties with Kenya would make significant contribution to Bangladesh's access to the African market, as Kenya was a member-country of African Union and East African Community. He urged Kenya to import readymade garments, leather and plastic goods, ceramics, processed seafood and agro products from Bangladesh to enhance bilateral trade, and increase mutual cooperation in tourism, ICT, blue economy and agriculture.



Vice President of FBCCI Md. Amin Helaly assured all kinds of support from FBCCI to strengthen bilateral relations.

Seminar titled Energy Security for Sustainable Development organized by FBCCI



Power, Energy and Mineral Resources Adviser to the Prime Minister Dr. Tawfiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury BB informed while virtually joining the seminar titled 'Energy Security for Sustainable Development' organized by FBCCI on August 4, 2022 that industry and agriculture would get priority in rationing of electricity in the country.

He noted that the Ukraine crisis had disrupted the world's energy supply chain and the government had to opt for electricity rationing to deal with this situation. The initiative has been taken for uninterrupted power supply in the industries and agricultural sector.



While attending as the special guest, the Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister Dr. Ahmad Kaikus informed that the government took special care of the industries and services sectors.



In his welcome address, the FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin said that the government should now emphasize on coal-based power generation. Mentioning that many developed countries are going back to coal-based power, he suggested that Bangladesh should gear up coal exploration in order to generate more power with coal. He called for expansion of offshore exploration and drilling, and strengthening of BAPEX.

While presenting the keynote paper, FBCCI's Panel Adviser and retired BUET Professor Dr. Ijaz Hossain said that the average growth of the industries sector had been hampered due to shortage of gas. Sole dependency on gas for power generation is putting the country's energy security at risk, he noted. For ensuring long term energy security, he suggested expansion of gas exploration activities, increasing the use of coal in power generation – especially with local coal, and adopting cost-effective energy strategies.

Seminar on Bangladesh Delta Plan 2100: Private Sector Involvement to Achieve a Safe, Climate-Resilient and Prosperous Delta

Experts called for more engagement of the private sector for attaining the goals of Bangladesh Delta Plan 2100. At a seminar titled 'Bangladesh Delta Plan 2100: Private Sector Involvement to Achieve a Safe, Climate-Resilient and Prosperous Delta' organized by FBCCI on August 6, 2022.



In his welcome address, the FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin called for direct involvement of the private sector in the effective implementation of Delta Plan. He noted that the implementation of Delta Plan 2100 would require financing equivalent to 2.5% of GDP per year, of which 20% is envisaged to come from the private sector. Enhanced private sector engagement would boost up the pace and quality of river management, water supplies in urban and rural areas, waste management, flood control and drainage management, he opined.

While speaking as the chief guest, the State Minister for Planning Dr. Shamsul Alam opined that the revenue structure should be development-oriented instead of income-oriented. He, therefore, called for a review of the import duty on dredgers.

The keynote paper was presented by the former Additional Director General of Bangladesh Water Development Board Dr. Md. Mizanur Rahman.

While speaking as a special guest, the Senior Secretary of the Ministry of Water Resources Kabir Bin Anwar stressed on good governance in the implementation of Delta Plan.

The FBCCI panel advisor and Founder Director of Channel I Shykh Seraj opined that the research activities were slower compared to the pace of climate change, which often did not allow the research outputs to be applied effectively.

Seminar on Bangabandhu's Economic and Business Thought

Speakers at a seminar organized by FBCCI on Bangabandhu's Economic and Business Thought on August 7, 2022 commented that Bangabandhu's Philosophy was still relevant in the country's development journey.

While speaking as the chief guest, the commerce minister Tipu Munshi recalled that Bangabandhu could recognize the exploitation by West Pakistan soon after the creation of Pakistan. The visionary leader wanted to secure economic freedom for the Bangalis, hence his 6-points accommodated economy-related issues in three of the points.



The Private Industry and Investment Advisor to the Prime Minister Salman F Rahman claimed, Bangabandhu's visionary planning brought about diversity in the export sector. The mandatory 40% export of non-traditional products in private barter had facilitated the export of shrimp and tea. The advisor also mentioned that Bangabandhu initiated the denationalization of industries, but he was assassinated before he could implement that decision.

FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin noted that based on Bangabandhu's philosophy, Bangladesh had become a developing country in all aspects of development. The President hailed various development initiatives of Bangabandhu for the expansion of trade and businesses.



Seminar on Regulation of Digital, Social Media & OTT Platforms: The Need to Strike the Right Balance



Digital, social media & OTT platform entrepreneurs and experts have demanded industry-friendly regulations so that this new media can harness the potentials of new economic opportunities. They made this demand at the seminar titled, ‘Regulation of Digital, Social Media & OTT Platforms: The Need to Strike the Right Balance’ organized by FBCCI on August 13 at FBCCI Bhaban.

They claimed that digital platforms emerged with new opportunities for creative production, employment, and showcasing of country’s culture globally. Hence, the rules and regulations should not be regulatory; rather these should facilitate the growth of the industry. The speakers also apprehended that, two different regulations prepared by the ministries of Information and Broadcasting, and Post, Telecommunications and Information Technology might contradict each other during implementation.

Responding to these concerns while speaking as the chief guest, the Minister for Post, Telecommunications and Information Technology Mostafa Jabbar pointed out that the two ministries have different areas of supervision. Therefore, there was no scope for conflict in the future, he assured.

The Minister supported the upcoming regulation and noted that Facebook and YouTube followed USA-based community standards, many of which were not suitable for Bangladesh. The regulation would ensure the consistency of online contents with the norms and values of Bangladesh, he opined. He also announced that the home network of 5G would be launched in January next year.

President Md. Jashim Uddin urged the policy makers not to hinder the growth of the newly emerging potential sectors. He also stressed on further demarcation of the scope for monitoring by the two ministries. The President called for grabbing the digital opportunities by projecting the country’s very own culture on the global platforms.

Seminar on Bangabandhu’s Thought on SME Development and Present Perspective

Commercial banks in Bangladesh distributed 18% of their total disbursed loans to SMEs. But only 9% SMEs have access to bank finance, and the rest 91% remains unbanked. Moreover, the proportion of SME loans has declined in recent years, which put their growth and sustainability at risk. This was revealed by FBCCI’s panel advisor and CPD’s research director Dr. Khandakar Golam Moazzem while presenting the keynote paper at the seminar titled ‘Bangabandhu’s Thought on SME Development and Present Perspective’ organized by FBCCI on August 14, 2022.

While speaking as the chief guest, the Industries Minister Nurul Majid Mahmud Humayun expressed his dissatisfaction with bank financing of SMEs. “Generating profit by selling dollars is not the job of the banks - this is not ethical”, the minister commented. “The Government approved bank licences with a condition to perform with commitment to the nation.

The Industries Minister lamented that everyone spoke about SMEs, but nobody works sincerely for their advancement. He also stressed on strengthening the SME Foundation through additional financing.



FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin said that SMEs were the backbone of the economy. However, banks were reluctant to finance them as they felt comfortable with large companies. Terming access to finance as the biggest challenge for SMEs, the President recalled that the Prime Minister’s loan incentive package for large industries was distributed in three months, whereas incentives for SMEs were not disbursed even in two years.

ILO and FBCCI Join Hands to Boost Workplace Safety in Industries

The Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) and International Labour Organization (ILO) have signed an agreement on August 17, 2022 at FBCCI premises to enhance workplace safety and health in ten priority sectors of the economy.

Under the agreement, a number of capacity building and promotional activities will be undertaken to strengthen workplace safety and healthcare at institutional as well as enterprise levels. These activities will be supported by ILO’s RMG Programme funded by Canada and the Netherlands.

Through this initiative, 15 safety units will be established to promote a culture of safety in ten industries, viz. electronic & electrical, chemical, plastic, light engineering, leather, food processing, furniture, printing and packaging, domestic RMG, and steel re-rolling.



Simultaneously, 2400 safety representatives and 100 safety committees will be groomed to improve awareness and capacity on workplace safety and healthcare among the employers and workers.

Speaking on the occasion, FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin asserted, “Ensuring the safety of workers is our utmost priority. We have teamed up with the ILO to invest in strong and functional safety units, safety committees and safety representatives. Strengthening workplace safety and health at institutional and enterprise levels will make our factories safer and more productive, which will benefit the national economy,”

The Country Director of ILO Bangladesh Tuomo Poutiainen stated, “ILO is pleased to join forces with FBCCI to promote safety culture and practices in priority industries. We hope that our collective efforts will help prevent many occupational accidents, injuries and diseases, and save countless lives.”

FBCCI Scholarships for AUW Students

FBCCI will award scholarships to 30 female students per year for higher education, and the awarded students will have the opportunity to study at the Asian University for Women (AUW). A MoU was signed for the purpose by FBCCI and AUW on September 10, 2022 at the FBCCI Bhaban. The FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin and the AUW Vice-Chancellor Dr. Rubana Huq signed the MoU on behalf of their respective organizations. The MoU will remain effective initially for 5 years.



While speaking at the signing ceremony, the FBCCI President said that his organization was coming forward after getting imbued with a sense of social responsibility to enable underprivileged women access higher education. This initiative would promote women’s empowerment and their participation in the country’s development process, he noted.

The Vice-Chancellor of Asian University for Women Dr. Rubana Huq pointed out that the underprivileged women had to struggle against many hurdles while accessing higher education. Her university aimed for inclusivity to ensure that no women were left behind. Currently, 1,300 female students from 19 countries were studying at the Asian University for Women, she informed.

FBCCI to Team up with Bangladesh Trade Facilitation Project

FBCCI will team up with Bangladesh Trade Facilitation (BTF) project facilitated by the US Department of Agriculture to work on Policy and Reform Advocacy, organizing joint events and interventions, and engaging associations and traders in specific interventions.

The joint effort is expected to simplify, modernise, and harmonise processes for the export, import and transit of agricultural goods by extending support to Bangladesh in implementing the World Trade Organization’s Trade Facilitation Agreement (WTO-TFA) through improved process harmonization, formalities and pre-clearance processing, transparency of trade information and WTO notification compliance, strengthening risk management systems, improving laboratories and testing procedures, and enhancing cold storage infrastructure for perishable goods.



A meeting on the subject was held on August 29, 2022 at the FBCCI premises, which was participated by the FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin, the Project Director of Bangladesh Trade Facilitation (BTF) project, and the Chief of Party of Land O'Lakes Venture37 Michael J. Parr.

Meeting with JICA Delegation

FBCCI has sought cooperation from Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) in establishing lab facilities at land, sea and international airports of the country. FBCCI Senior Vice President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu made this request during a meeting held with the representatives of JICA and Bangladesh Food Safety Authority (BFSA) on September 1, 2022 at FBCCI premises.

The north-eastern states of India have huge demand for Bangladeshi food and agro products. Therefore, accredited lab facilities at land ports would facilitate export of these products to those states, the Senior Vice President noted, adding these facilities at land, sea and airports would aid Bangladesh in reaching the global food market. Hence, he urged JICA to come up with a technical assistance project.



Vice President Md. Amin Helaly disclosed that a significant portion of the country's agricultural produce rotted due to poor supply chain and dearth of preservation system, and the farmers were also deprived of fair prices. Therefore, he urged JICA to extend assistance in food processing and preservation at the upazila level.

FBCCI Safety Council organized Training on OSH

The FBCCI Safety Council organized a training workshop on ensuring Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) in association with the International Labor Organization (ILO). The safety cell representatives from 4 chambers and 12 associations as well as ILO representatives participated in the workshop. FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin inaugurated the two-day training workshop titled 'Basic OSH and OSH Management System' at the FBCCI premises on October 1, 2022.



While speaking on the occasion, the federation chief said that occupational safety and health should be ensured in all industries of the country. Safe industry is crucial in the transition of Bangladesh from LDC to a developing country. Many sectors produce world-class products, and ensuring a decent workplace would pave the way for exporting those products, he added.

Among others, FBCCI Senior Vice-President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu, Liakat Ali Bhuiyan Milan, Mohiuddin Kamal, representatives from different related sectors and FBCCI Secretary General Mohammad Mahfuzul Hoque were present at the meeting.



Seminar on Enabling Policy for Sustainable Plastic Waste Management

The country's apex trade body FBCCI and the largest FMCG company 'Unilever Bangladesh' jointly organized a high-level multi-stakeholder' seminar titled, 'Enabling Policy for Sustainable Plastic Waste Management on October 8, 2022 at a city hotel.



Minister for Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives (LGRD) Md. Tajul Islam graced the occasion as the chief guest. Md. Shahab Uddin, MP, Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, and Md. Tofazzal Hossain Miah, Senior Secretary of Prime Minister's Office were present as special guests. The event was presided over by the FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin.



While speaking as the chief guest, Md. Tajul Islam said, "We will have to find innovative and smart solutions for waste management. However, waste collection is currently not considered to be sustainable as it is still not viewed as a business proposition. An effective solution would be to follow the circular system which ensures that the consumption of plastic does not increase and moves towards a sustainable waste management model.

The Senior Secretary at PMO Tofazzal Hossain Miah said, "Bangladesh Government's Vision 2041 has incorporated Plastic Waste Management in its Sustainable Urbanisation Goals. Proper management of plastic waste capability and efficiency will be required if we want to upgrade our country to a high-income one".

In his welcome speech, Md. Jashim Uddin said, "It is very common that plastic usage will increase with Per Capita Income and GDP, so the use of more plastic is a good sign for the economy. Using more plastic is not the problem; rather, plastic waste management is the main challenge. One key area for intervention is creation of mass awareness about waste disposal.

FBCCI organized seminar on Bond Market: The Ultimate Solution for Long-term Financing

FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin has welcomed the introduction of treasury bonds in the stock market at a seminar titled ‘Bond Market: The Ultimate Solution for Long-term Financing’ held at the FBCCI premises on October 11, 2022. In his welcome address, the FBCCI chief said that the Country lacks long term financing institutions. As the banks receive short deposits, they disburse loans for short term, which often pushes entrepreneurs to become unwilful defaulters, as they have to pay instalments before getting any returns from investment. Therefore, Bond Market can be an effective solution for long term financing.

While speaking as the chief guest at the seminar, Private Industry and Investment Advisor to the Prime Minister Salman F Rahman said, stock market in Bangladesh was only composed of equity transactions. However, the bond market is an integral part of a capital market and makes it vibrant. Recognizing this need, the government has taken the initiative to introduce bonds in the capital market, the Advisor noted.



Speaking as the special guest, Bangladesh Securities and Exchange Commission (BSEC) Chairman Professor Shibli Rubayat-Ul-Islam informed that BSEC planned to launch orange bonds for women entrepreneurs, pink for small and micro entrepreneurs, and a startup board for financing new entrepreneurs.

FBCCI Senior Vice President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu assured of all support from FBCCI in popularising the bond market. Vice Chairman of Shanta Asset Management Limited Arif Khan CFA, FCMA presented the keynote paper at the seminar.

Discussion meeting with JICA officials on Matarbari-Moheshkhali project

The Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) should facilitate the establishment of a petrochemical industry in Matarbari-Moheshkhali project area, said Md Jashim Uddin, the President of FBCCI. He also called for undertaking development projects for the growth of a sustainable energy sector. The FBCCI chief came up with the call during a discussion meeting with JICA officials regarding Matarbari-Moheshkhali project held at FBCCI premises on October 13, 2022.



He said, Bangladesh’s unique geographical location and blue economy have huge potentials. However, harnessing these opportunities would require further development of infrastructure, ports, and the energy sector, he noted. Therefore, JICA, as a trusted development partner of Bangladesh should devise projects for the purpose, the President urged

Deputy Director of the JICA Headquarters Ms. Asakawa Yuka hoped that the private sector of Bangladesh would cooperate to make the Matarbari-Moheshkhali integrated development initiative successful.



FBCCI Director and MCCI President Md. Saiful Islam called for JICA's cooperation in FBCCI's Innovation and Research Center. Director Abul Kasem Khan pointed out that JICA might conduct a feasibility study on conversion of the existing 4 lane Dhaka-Chattogram highway to 8-lanes, as well as development of the logistic sector.

Vice-President Md. Habib Ullah Dawn and Director Engr. Ghulam Mohammed Alomgir urged the Japanese companies to set up chip manufacturing industry for electronic devices. Among others, Director Amzad Hussain spoke at the meeting.

Business Meeting with Brunei Delegation

FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin urged the visiting delegation from Brunei to consider Bangladesh as their next trade and investment destination. He came up with this call during a breakfast meeting held on October 16, 2022 at a hotel in Dhaka.

“We have on-going development projects to facilitate investment, which include deep seaports, 100 Special Economic Zones, Hi-Tech Parks, Tourism Parks, Nuclear Power plant, Metro Rail, LNG Terminal and construction of road and railways for bringing the whole country under a common network. So, our story is now very different from what it was before, and Brunei can choose Bangladesh as their next destination for trade and investment”, the president remarked.



“We foresee the scope of strengthening cooperation in trade and investment with a focus on development and innovation, food processing, ICT, plastic, petrochemical, shipbuilding, tourism, infrastructure development, petroleum and energy, and knowledge transfer to facilitate the transition through 4 IR”, the FBCCI Chief added.

The chief guest Commerce Minister Tipu Munshi urged the Brunei Finance Minister to remove the discriminatory rule for Bangladeshi immigrant workers who had to deposit \$1600, while the amount was only \$500 for Malaysian workers.

A MoU was signed in the meeting between ZES Trading & Ghanim International Corporation to introduce Halal Food from Brunei in the Bangladeshi market. Dr. Nur Rahman from Ghanim International and FBCCI director Dr. Kazi Ertaza Hassan CIP signed the MoU on behalf of their organizations.



Networking Dinner in honor of President of Confederation of British Industry & Chancellor of the University of Birmingham Lord Karan Bilimoria

FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin has opined that Bangladesh should sign FTA with UK – one of the giant developments cum trading partners of Bangladesh. He expressed this opinion at the ‘Networking Dinner’ in honor of the President of Confederation of British Industry (CBI) & Chancellor of the University of Birmingham Lord Karan Bilimoria, CBE, DL, FCA on October 18, 2022 at a hotel in Dhaka.

The FBCCI chief sought CBI President’s support in Bangladesh’s initiatives for signing FTA with UK and also solicited his assistance for continuing the existing trade benefits received from UK during post-LDC period. “We look forward to the future of our engagements through signing an MoU with CBI and joint programs for business promotion, industry-academia partnerships and skills development,” the president added.



While speaking as the chief guest, the Industries Minister Nurul Majid Mahmud Humayun praised the democracy of Bangladesh and described the economic success stories that took place during the 14 years’ tenure of present government. The UK would remain a friend in the future journey of Bangladesh towards a developed country, the minister hoped.

British High Commissioner Robert Chatterton Dickson urged Bangladesh to work on getting more UK companies interested in investing in Bangladesh. He also suggested further improving the business environment.

Discussion Meeting with CII of India

Bangladesh may apply the Indian experience in the development of their SMEs. The speakers expressed this opinion during a discussion meeting held on October 19, 2022 with a Confederation of India Industries (CII) and FMC delegation at the FBCCI premises.

For developing cooperation, SME Foundation Managing Director Md. Mafizur Rahman called for signing a MoU by SME foundation and its counterpart in India.

While chairing the meeting, FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin said, Bangladesh had huge potential in the cluster-based SMEs. Both the countries could benefit if Bangladesh harnessed the Indian experience in flourishing SMEs, he opined. About 80% of the businesses operating in Bangladesh were SMEs. Hence, there was no alternative to SME development to keep the economic pace afloat, the president added.

Seminar titled Role of PPP in achieving Vision 2041



In the context of the current global scenario, there is no alternative to Public Private Partnership (PPP) to deal with the crisis that Bangladesh is facing now. The Private Industry and Investment Adviser to the Prime Minister Salman F Rahman expressed this view at a seminar titled 'Role of PPP in achieving Vision 2041' held at FBCCI premises on October 29, 2022. "To deal with the reserve crisis and budget limitations, PPP can finance the country's development projects and drive the country towards the Vision-2041" the adviser noted.

The FBCCI Director Abu Motaleb urged the consumers not to buy more goods than they actually needed at a time.

Discussion meeting to review import, stock, supply position of essential goods held

A discussion meeting with the concerned traders was held at FBCCI on June 2 to review the import, stock, supply and price situation of essential commodities.

While speaking as chief guest, the FBCCI President Md Jashim Uddin said that the rich can afford if the prices of luxury items go up; but price hike of essential commodities makes the lower income people suffer. The business leaders should therefore take the responsibility in their respective sectors to keep the market situation stable.



FBCCI Chief urged the businessmen to conduct businesses with honesty and transparency and not increase the prices of spices, oil and other essential commodities ahead of Eid-ul-Adha.

He opined these dishonest businessmen should be identified and brought under the purview of law.

MoU inked with the Greater New York Chamber

FBCCI has signed an MoU with Greater New York Chamber of Commerce and Industry with a view to facilitating mainstream trade and investment between Bangladesh and the USA. The signing ceremony took place during a seminar titled '25th September: Bangabandhu's Vision and Bangladeshi Immigrant Day' held on September 25, 2022 in New York, USA. President of the two chambers Md. Jashim Uddin and Mark Jeff signed the MoU on behalf of their respective organizations.



The USA has remained a friend in Bangladesh's journey towards growth and resiliency. Therefore, beyond RMG, the FBCCI chief urged the US companies to source other products from Bangladesh's diverse export basket.

Md. Jashim Uddin recalled that under the leadership of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, Bangladesh registered the highest GDP growth of 9.6% in 1974 - shortly after the devastating liberation war. Despite the remarkable progress in socioeconomic indices over the last decade, the country has not yet been able to reach that record, he pointed out.

Roundtable discussion on Financial and Professional Services - the role of standards and regulations on the road to net zero

President of FBCCI Mr. Md. Jashim Uddin said that the private sector is working with the government of Bangladesh to implement environment-friendly industrialization. He made this remark during a roundtable discussion on Financial and Professional Services - the role of standards and regulations on the road to net zero at the Commonwealth Trade & Investment Summit 2022 at London on December 5, 2022.

He mentioned that despite being one of the lowest emitters in the world, Bangladesh committed to cutting carbon emissions by 89.47 million tonnes, equivalent to 21.85% of carbon dioxide by 2030 as part of global efforts to control the emissions.

The President noted that the government of Bangladesh is working with the private sector to implement environmentally friendly industrialization. The industries of Bangladesh are increasingly looking to innovate and move for maintaining environmentally friendly standards, he added.



He suggested that climate financing may be mobilized through blending climate finance, private sector investment, innovative financings such as green or blue bonds, risk transfer mechanisms or insurance can be looked into. Green transformation and a boost in harnessing global climate finance multilateral funds can be an option.



The roundtable was moderated by Bronek Masojada, Chair of the East End Community Foundation and Alderman of the City of London. Senior Vice-President of FBCCI Mr. Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu, FBCCI Director Mr. Md. Jamal Uddin, Mr. Mohammed Bazlur Rahman, Mr. Abu Hossain Bhuiyan (Ranu), and other members of the Bangladesh business delegation were also present in the roundtable.

Roundtable discussion on Invest in Gabon – Climate & Sustainability Finance

Bangladesh is keen to work with Gabon, a country lying on the west coast of Africa in the Green and Circular Economy sector. FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin made this remark on a Roundtable discussion on Invest in Gabon – Climate & Sustainability Finance organized by the Government of Gabon on December 6, 2022 in London. The meeting was hosted by the Govt. of Gabon on the occasion of the Commonwealth Trade and Investment Summit at Mansion House, London.

FBCCI President mentioned that the world is facing a triple and interconnected crisis: the climate emergency, rapid damage to biodiversity, and extreme poverty. The next ten years are crucial to prepare, adapt and transform our societies, economies, and all ecosystems, he noted.

He further said that the private sector has a defining role in both mitigating the potential damages brought by a carbon-intensive, ‘business-as-usual’ global economy and finding new, innovative, and catalytic methods for adapting to a changing climate.

Bangladesh-UK Trade & Investment Roundtable-2022

FBCCI seeks partnership with the United Kingdom in technology transfer and supply chain development in order to ensure LDC graduation and to meet the challenges of the fourth industrial revolution.

While attending the Bangladesh-UK Trade & Investment Roundtable-2022 at London on December 07, 2022 the FBCCI president Md. Jashim Uddin said, that Bangladesh's journey towards development is at a new height.

The Govt. is doing everything for creating new opportunities for businesses and investors. But to face the challenges of LDC graduation by 2026 and integration into the fourth Industrial revolution, our urgent requirement is technology transfer and joint venture partnership in the global supply chain, he noted. The president said that Innovative knowledge should be applied in agricultural and industrial production and service sectors. FBCCI wants UK's partnership in these cases.



He invited the UK gov. and business leaders to take part in the Bangladesh Business Summit in Dhaka to be organized on the occasion of 50th anniversary of FBCCI, which will see high-level participation from around the globe. He informed that the Business Summit will showcase the competitiveness of Bangladesh in the above-mentioned areas which implies doing business.

Standing Committee on Rehabilitation of Sick Industries

Standing Committee on Transportation and Communication (Rail, Roads & Highways)

The first meeting of FBCCI Standing Committee on Transportation and Communication (Rail, Roads & Highways) was held on April 17, 2022 at FBCCI. The meeting discussed about the financial loss due to traffic jam and possible solutions for smoother communication.



FBCCI Senior Vice President Mr. Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu urged the government to halt the road construction and repair work for 14 days during Eid Journey. FBCCI Vice President and Director-in-Charge of the Committee Mr. Md. Aminul Haque Shamim said, Congestion at Tongi incurs huge loss daily. Chairman of the committee and President of the Bangladesh Bus Truck Owners Association Mr. Ramesh Chandra Ghosh presided over the meeting.

Standing Committee on Electrical & Electronics Merchandise



The first meeting of the Standing Committee on Electrical & Electronics Merchandise was held on May 14, 2022 at FBCCI. FBCCI President Mr. Md. Jashim Uddin urged the businessmen to ensure the quality of products in order to utilize the potential of global market for electronics products. FBCCI Senior Vice-President Mr. Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu said, we should provide full cooperation to these sectors including electrical, which can generate revenue by exporting products to world market.



FBCCI Vice President and Director-in-Charge of the Committee Mr. M A Razzak Khan urged for policy support for electronics sector to flourish. The meeting was chaired by Former Director of FBCCI and Chairman of the committee Engr. Mohd. Mohabbat Ullah.

Standing Committee on Tourism Development

At least 6 goals of the SDGs are directly and the rest indirectly related to tourism. Therefore, if tourism is not flourished, the achievement of sustainable development goals by 2030 will be hampered. Consequently, there is no alternative to development of tourism in Bangladesh. These remarks were made by speakers during the first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Tourism Development (Inbound, Outbound, Domestic, & Civil Aviation) at FBCCI on May 23, 2022.



“There are 109 sectors directly linked with tourism and 1100 sub-sectors indirectly linked to the industry. Every single tourist creates 10 direct and 35 indirect employment opportunities. Therefore, tourism should be treated as a priority sector,” the participants opined. They discussed the potentials of tourism sector, which was seriously affected by the Covid-19 pandemic.

The tour operators urged the government to officially declare the country open to foreign tourists, similar to the declaration made for overseas businessmen. This will encourage overseas tourists to visit Bangladesh. At the same time, they demanded resumption of the ‘on-arrival visa’ facility.

The Director in-Charge of the standing committee M.G.R. Nasir Majumder assured that the FBCCI would continue to extend maximum assistance for the growth of the tourism industry. The meeting was presided over by the chairman of the standing committee Taufiq Uddin Ahmed.

Standing Committee on Paper, Paper Products, Printing and Packaging

Paper importers and printing and packaging sector leaders have called for reducing import duty on papers that are not manufactured locally. They made this call at the first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Paper, Paper Products, Printing and Packaging held on June 4, 2022.



The speakers revealed that only eleven types of papers are produced locally; other types are imported from abroad by paying 47% duty. On the other hand, despite being self-sufficient in

paper production, India imposes 18 per cent, Indonesia 19 per cent and China 17 per cent. As Bangladesh is import dependent, the businessmen called for reducing this duty to 3 to 5 per cent. At the same time, they urged the government to facilitate the import of paper for the NCTB Books with zero duty.

Chairman of the standing committee Md. Esharot Hossain said, printing sector would contribute to the country's economy like the garment sector if the government provided proper policy support. Among others, FBCCI Directors Bijoy Kumar Kejriwal, Abu Motaleb, Hafez Harun, and Rezaul Islam Milon were also present.

Standing Committee on Iron, Carbon Steel, Stainless Steel and Re-rolling Industries

The FBCCI Standing Committee on Iron, Carbon Steel, Stainless Steel and Re-rolling Industries has urged the government to reconsider the price of rods in development projects.

The Chairman of the Committee and President of Bangladesh Steel Manufacturers Association Manwar Hossain made this call at the first meeting of the committee held at FBCCI on June 5, 2022.



The Chairman of the Standing Committee also discouraged new investments in the steel and cement sectors by taking bank loan, as these two sectors have overcapacity. The Director in charge of the committee Md. Jamal Uddin said, the construction sector has been contributing a lot to the nation's development. By they have been running their business with even 25 to 30% loss. Many giant construction companies have now shut down their businesses due to the sky-high price of rods.

Speaking as the chief guest, FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin said, both steel and construction are strong sectors and they both face many challenges. He called upon the committee to identify those challenges, and assured maximum cooperation from the FBCCI.

Standing Committee on Press, Media and Cultural Affairs

The FBCCI Standing Committee on Press, Media and Cultural Affairs will strive to resolve the problems prevailing in the Print and Electronic Media. Director-in-Charge of the Committee Dr. Kazi Ertaza Hassan made this commitment during the first meeting of the Committee held on June 16, 2022 at FBCCI.

FBCCI Senior Vice President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu disclosed that the Print and Electronic media are suffering from various problems; especially the price of newsprint paper is a big issue for the newspapers. Therefore, the Senior Vice President requested the Committee to identify the problems and potentials and come up with specific recommendations.

Director in charge of the committee Dr. Kazi Ertaza Hassan said that price hike of paper and ink is the biggest challenge for newspapers. The rise of the online portals shrinks the advertisement market for printed ones, making the owners face an extra challenge. However, he assured that initiatives would be taken to resolve the crises.



The meeting was chaired by the chairman of the committee H R Delwar Hossain Raja. He said the proposals and recommendations made at the meeting would be forwarded to the concerned ministry after discussions with the FBCCI president.

Standing Committee on Local Garments

Businessmen urged the government to postpone the decision of closing shops, shopping malls, markets, and kitchen markets after 8 pm till the Eid-ul-Adha. They came up with this call during the first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Local Garments held on June 18, 2022 at FBCCI Bhaban.



Responding to the demands of businessmen, FBCCI Senior Vice-President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu called for postponement of the government decision till Eid-ul-Adha. "The office-goers prefer to visit malls after evening; therefore, this directive will discourage them to go for shopping, which would cause further losses to millions of small and micro entrepreneurs," he pointed out.

Alauddin Manik said that they met huge domestic demands and thus helped reduce import costs. The sector would further flourish if the entrepreneurs got bank loans on easy terms, he added.

Director-in-Charge of the Committee Abu Motaleb complained that the tax-officials harassed businessmen in the name of collecting revenue. He called for an end to this harassment.

Standing Committee on Capital Market

The first meeting of the Standing Committee on Capital Market was held on June 19, 2022 at FBCCI.

Director-in-Charge of the Committee Md. Amzad Hussain disclosed at the meeting that the FBCCI would take initiatives to strengthen the bond market in order to aid long-term financing in setting up industries in the country.

Calling for the development of the bond market, Md. Amjad Hussain said that if the bond market improved, then dependence on the stock market and banks would decrease. Diversification of fundraising will increase through this in the long run. He also announced a plan for undertaking awareness program to enlist giant corporations in capital market.



Speaking as the chief guest, FBCCI Vice President Md. Amin Helaly called upon the Standing Committee to disseminate information and knowledge for further development of the capital market. Shakil Rizvi, chairman of the standing committee said that the standing committee would organize training programs on capital market across the country through the district chambers.

Standing Committee on Real Estate and Housing

FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin has called for establishing a separate authority to approve structural design of buildings to ensure their safety. He also urged the RAJUK to revise the new Detailed Area Plan – DAP.

The President came up with this suggestion at the first meeting of the Standing Committee on Real Estate and Housing held at FBCCI on July 31, 2022. Joining the meeting virtually, the President informed that RAJUK approves the architectural design of the building, but there is no agency to approve the structural design. Hence, separate authority should be formed to ensure the safety of buildings.



Earlier, Vice President Md. Amin Helaly suggested that REHAB should come up with a model village plan that would include all modern facilities to ensure decent living in rural areas.

Vice President Md. Habib Ullah Dawn suggested that REHAB should continue its discussion with the Bangladesh Bank Governor and relevant associations to facilitate project loans in the real estate sector.



Standing Committee Director in-charge and REHAB President Alamgir Shamsul Alamin Kajal claimed that the sector has become more compliant over the years. The REHAB Members hand over to customers about 10 thousand flats on an average annually.

The Standing Committee Chairman Liakat Ali Bhuiyan Milan said, the Committee would analyse and recommend needed policies for flourishing the real estate sector.

The second meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Real Estate and Housing was held on November 27, 2022 at the FBCCI. During the meeting, businessmen mentioned the Floor Area Ratio (FAR) in the new DAP as a big challenge in developing this sector. They claimed that the Real Estate sector is going to face a crisis due to the limitation in making multistoried buildings and the land registration fee which will be determined according to the market price.



Director In-charge of the committee and President of REHAB Mr. Alamgir Shamsul Alamin said that there are many good aspects in the new DAP; some complications are there at the same time.

High prices of construction materials made the construction sector into a crisis, as mentioned by the Chairman of the committee Al-haj Liakat Ali Bhuiyan Milan.

Standing Committee on Import

Importers of essential commodities and raw materials have called for proper management in the ports and an end to harassment by customs officials and shipping agents. They made this call during the first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Import held on October 26, 2022.

The importers complained that they had been harassed by the port and customs officials as well as shipping agents while releasing imported goods that resulted in extra time and money thereby pushing up the business and production costs.



The laboratory at Chittagong Port lacks necessary testing facilities, and only one chemical examiner is not sufficient for swift testing and certification. In addition, goods are frequently sent to different university labs for examination, as the port lab is not capable. This takes more than a month thereby causing interruption in the product supply chain, the businessmen claimed.

Speaking as the chief guest, FBCCI Senior Vice President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu noted that the importers with less experience mainly make mistakes in HS code. He therefore called for better study of HS code. He further said that it was the businessmen's responsibility to help the government in revenue collection.

Director In-Charge of the committee and FBCCI Vice President Md. Amin Helaly informed that products of European and American standard were being manufactured in Bangladesh. He urged the businessmen to harness this capacity and ensure compliance. The meeting was presided over by the Chairman of the committee and A2P group Mohammad Khorshed Alam.

Standing Committee on Information and Communications Technology (ICT) and Digitization of Trade Bodies

As in other countries, the risks of cyber-attacks on businesses and financial institutions are increasing in Bangladesh. Medium-sized businesses are most vulnerable to cyber-threats, as these establishments lack sufficient technical capabilities and staff awareness to deal with cyber-attacks. This was revealed by speakers during the 2nd meeting of the Standing Committee on Information and Communications Technology (ICT) and Digitization of Trade Bodies' held at the FBCCI premises on September 22, 2022.

About 66 percent of the business enterprises across the globe have experienced cyber-attacks at least once. Between 2002 and 2020, the rate of such attacks increased by 80 percent, the speakers informed the meeting. Around 93 percent of cyber-attacks occur through phishing emails; hacking through Social Media Engineering is also increasing.



The entrepreneurs therefore called for awareness-building and cyber-education of employees to ensure security of vital information in respective organizations.

Standing Committee Director in-charge Syed Almas Kabir told the gathering that FBCCI would undertake awareness-generation activities to ensure the protection of information of business organizations, including through hosting a number of seminars and releasing awareness posters illustrating cyber hygiene. Chairman of the committee Md. Shahid-Ul-Munir urged the members to work together to ensure cyber security.

Standing Committee on Non-Bank Financial Institutions

Non-Bank Financial Institutions (NBFIs) have demanded the withdrawal of 7 per cent interest cap on deposits. They came up with the demand during the first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Non-Bank Financial Institutions held on September 28, 2022 at FBCCI.

Speakers at the meeting informed that as per the instructions issued by Bangladesh Bank, NBFIs cannot offer more than 7% interest on deposits, which was lower than what the banks could offer to their clients. Therefore, this restriction puts the NBFIs at a disadvantage compared to banks. The central bank's loan moratorium facilities are also applicable only for banks and these policies are discriminatory to the country's NBFIs, the committee members alleged. Besides, they urged the central bank to increase the size of the refinancing scheme for NBFIs.



Expressing solidarity with the demand made at the meeting, FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin assured that FBCCI would soon take up the issue of cap on deposit interest rate with the central bank. There should not be any discriminatory policies applicable for banks and NBFIs, he opined.

Chairman of the Standing Committee Matiur Rahman chaired the meeting. Among others, Director in-charge of the committee S.M. Jahangir Alam (Manik), was present.

Standing Committee on Livestock, Poultry and Fisheries

Eggs and meat could be sold at much lower prices to consumers if the government provided policy support. Claiming this, the entrepreneurs have demanded equal policy support to the livestock, poultry and fish farmers, similar to what the agriculture sector enjoys. The committee members made this demand during the first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Livestock, Poultry and Fisheries held on October 1, 2022.



While speaking as the chief guest, the FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin said, the government should provide utilities at a special rate to the livestock farms. Bangladesh needs to export commodities worth \$300 billion to become a developed country by 2041, which may be tough to achieve by relying solely on RMG.

Director-in-charge of the committee and Vice-President of FBCCI Salahuddin Alamgir, said that as in agriculture, a 5 per cent interest rate obligation for bank loans should be kept for the livestock sector. He also demanded fixing the dollar rate at Taka 100 in case of livestock-related imports. The Vice-President also recommended introduction of insurance policies at low premiums to protect the farmers.

Chairman of the committee and Executive Member of Feed Industries Association of Bangladesh Md. Moshir Rahman called for strengthening the inter-ministerial coordination of government agencies.

Standing Committee on International Trade Fair and Foreign Delegation

FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin has emphasized on organizing sector-wise exhibitions, as trade exhibitions can play a crucial role in expanding and flourishing different sectors. While joining virtually the first meeting of the Standing Committee on International Trade Fair and Foreign Delegation held at the FBCCI premises on August 3, 2022.

The Federation chief recalled that international exhibitions played a positive role in the development of sectors like plastic, textile, and pharmaceuticals, as the small and medium entrepreneurs could find renowned global suppliers and buyers under a single umbrella. Hence, the President urged the standing committee to identify potential sectors for holding international exhibitions.



Vice President and Director in-charge of the committee Md. Amin Helaly said, the Export Promotion Bureau (EPB) should involve the private sector in organizing and attending fairs and exhibitions. To do so, he called for forming a joint committee with representations from EPB, Commerce Ministry and the private sector.

Committee Chairman Mohammad Nizamuddin Jitu called for the development of new export markets and diversification of export basket to keep the pace of economic growth afloat. He stressed on utilisation of the experiences gathered from foreign visits in the development of domestic industry.

Standing Committee on Plastic, Rubber, Melamine and PVC Products

Entrepreneurs from the plastic sector have demanded a business environment free from harassment caused by undue visits by the functionaries of government agencies. They made this call at the first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Plastic, Rubber, Melamine and PVC Products held at FBCCI premises on August 8, 2022.



Director in-charge of the committee Abu Motaleb claimed, conspiracy was still going on against the plastic sector. The committee would work to resolve the tax and environment-related problems in the sector, he informed. He called for eco-friendly production as well.



The committee chairman and President of BPGMEA Shamim Ahmed noted that waste management was the biggest challenge facing the plastic sector. He expressed the hope that Bangladesh would be able to realize the huge potentials of the sector if this challenge was properly dealt with.

Standing Committee on Logistics & Courier Services

The second meeting of the Standing Committee on Logistics & Courier Services was held at FBCCI premises on August 20, 2022. During discussions at the meeting, the entrepreneurs of these services demanded business-friendly Mailing Operator and Courier Service Development and Regulatory Authority Act-2022. They also urged the government to declare the courier and logistics sector as a service industry.



While speaking on the occasion as the chief guest, the FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin informed that FBCCI was preparing a 20-year roadmap for logistics development. He opined that the future expansion of the country's economy largely depended on logistics, as the sector builds up a sustainable supply chain. Attaining food security is impossible without an effective logistics ecosystem, the president held.

Director in-charge of the committee Md. Naser informed that the committee would soon prepare its recommendations for amendment of the draft law.

Chairman of the committee and President of Courier Services Association of Bangladesh Hafizur Rahman Pulok hoped that the courier and logistics companies would contribute more to the national economy if the government provided them proper policy and legal support.

Standing Committee on Port and Shipping

FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin has demanded setting up of testing labs at the ports to ensure faster delivery of imported products as well as uninterrupted production. The FBCCI chief made this demand at the 2nd meeting of the Standing Committee on Port and Shipping held on September 14, 2022 at FBCCI premises. Products imported via Chittagong Port were sent to the capital for testing, which took weeks or months, thereby delaying the delivery, increasing the cost of business, and disrupting production, the President noted. Therefore, he demanded establishment of testing labs at the port.



Chairman of the committee Dr. Md. Pervez Shazzad Akter said that the opening of Padma Bridge and Payra Port had provided the economy with new opportunities, but this required further development of port infrastructure if the benefits were to be harnessed fully.

Director-in-charge of the committee A. M. Mahub Chowdhury blamed the customs authorities for container congestion and expressed solidarity with the committee members regarding the demand for cancellation of incentives for customs officials for penalties imposed on importers.

Standing Committee on Automobiles

Despite fulfilling the criteria of 100% margin, importers cannot open LCs from the banks for importing cars, which puts businesses in a dire strait. Businessmen shared this experience during the 2nd meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Automobiles held on October 27, 2022 at FBCCI premises.

In Bangladesh, cars have long been considered luxury items, and government has imposed 100% LC margin on importing cars to deal with the dollar crisis. However, in the backdrop of the country's current economic standing, cars are considered as essential items, the businessmen opined. There is no alternative to trucks and pickups for goods transportation.



FBCCI Vice-President and Director in-charge of the committee Md. Habib Ullah Dawn called for solving the duty obstacles as well as incentives for the automobile industry. BRTA should include FBCCI representatives on behalf of the businesses for business-friendly and realistic policy formulation, he said.

While presiding over the meeting, the chairman of the committee Hafizur Rahman Khan demanded incentives for the sector. Joining the open discussion, the businessmen demanded amendment of the rule of mandatory driving license while purchasing motorcycle, harassment-free issuance of driving licence, specific HS code for electric vehicle, registration for three wheelers, and sector-friendly policy support.

Standing Committee on Printing, Packaging and Publication

Businessmen from packaging, printing and publication sector urged for more investment and government’s policy support to reach the thousands billion dollars international market.

In the first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Printing, Packaging and Publication held on November 3, 2022, committee member Ms. Shajada Shuchay Amin presented a presentation on the global potential packaging, printing and publishing sector.

Speaking as the chief guest, FBCCI president Md. Jashim Uddin said that the use of packaging is increasing along with the increase in the per capita income of the people; will also increase in future.



FBCCI Vice-President and committee director in-charge Md. Amin Helaly said that a huge number of publications are there in the country every year. Standard packaging is being hampered due to the increased production costs, which poses a threat to the packaging industries.



The meeting was presided over by Chairman of the Committee and Managing Director of Tampaco Group Safius Sami Alamgir. He sought necessary policy support from the government including international market research to exploit the export potential of the packaging sector.

Standing Committee on Banking and Leasing

The first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Banking and Leasing held at FBCCI office on November 05, 2022.



Speaking as the guest, FBCCI President stated that if the bank loan interest is extended, entrepreneurs will be negatively affected further. Price of raw materials, shipping cost, transportation cost have already been increased due to the Russia Ukraine war. Increase of loan interest will make defaulters more. He suggested reducing costs along with making banking services more effective to solve the current dollar crisis.

FBCCI Senior Vice-President and Director of the committee Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu called for policy support to continue industrial production.



Chairman of the committee and Former director of FBCCI AKM Shaheed Reza presided over the meeting. He also called for not increasing the interest rate of bank loans along with gas and uninterrupted electricity in factories.

Standing Committee on Women Entrepreneurship Development

The first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Women Entrepreneurship Development was held on November 09, 2022 at FBCCI. Mr. Md. Jashim Uddin, President of FBCCI as the chief guest, virtually joined the meeting.

Bank loan facilitation was demanded by the women entrepreneurs during the meeting.

The meeting was presided over by the Chairman of the committee and President of Patuakhali Women Chamber of Commerce and Industry Dr. Ismat Jerin Khan.



Standing Committee on Kachamal Aarothder, Marketing and Suppliers

The first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on “Kachamal Aarothder, Marketing and Suppliers” held on November 15, 2022.

Businessmen at the meeting claims that establishing modern storage, transportation and marketing network can reduce the price gap between growers and consumers level. They demand to stop extortion in transportation.



While speaking as the chief guest, FBCCI Senior Vice-President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu called RAJUK and REHAB to establish markets with modern facilities in the new housing projects in the city to ensure better market management. He urged the market committees to play an active role in preventing unfair competition and extortion in the markets.



Director-in-charge of the committee Hafez Harun highlighted the various programs of FBCCI in the past to keep the commodity market stable.

The meeting was presided by the chairman of the committee and president of Bangladesh Kachamal Aaroth Malik Samity Emran Master.

Standing Committee on Handicrafts, Handloom, Cottage Industries, Ethnic and Tribal Products

First meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on Handicrafts, Handloom, Cottage Industries, Ethnic and Tribal Products held November 22, 2022. Committee members urged the Export Promotion Bureau (EPB) to be more active in organizing fairs at home and abroad. At the same time, women entrepreneurs want the opportunity to participate in the fair by paying a nominal fee.



FBCCI Senior Vice President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu was present at the meeting as the chief guest. He said, “Fairs should not only be aimed at selling products. You have to bring orders from there. You have to improve product quality. Product diversification should be more emphasized. And Increase competitiveness.”



FBCCI Vice President Amin Helaly urged the entrepreneurs to submit specific proposals in written form about the challenges of handicrafts, handloom and cottage industry.

Committee Director-in-Charge Md. Ali Hossain Shishir said, Chairman Rashedul Karim Munna , FBCCI director Hafez Harun, Secretary General Mohammad Mahfuzul Hoque, co-chairmen other members of the committee were present in the meeting.

FBCCI Standing Committee on International Affairs, International Trade Bodies, Development Partners and Strategic Partners.

The first meeting of the FBCCI Standing Committee on International Affairs, International Trade Bodies, Development Partners and Strategic Partners held on May 31, 2022 at FBCCI.

The meeting was chaired by the Chairman of the committee and former Director of FBCCI Mr. Shafquat Haider. Mentioning the current economic situation of Sri Lanka, he called for focusing on trade and businesses seriously to save the business community as well as the country.



Speaking as chief guest at the meeting, FBCCI Vice-President Mr. Md. Amin Helaly said that FBCCI is working sincerely with the foreign ministry to boost the international trade and investment.



Director in-Charge of the committee Mr. Syed Moazzem Hossain informed at the meeting that FBCCI will organize seminars inviting the Ambassadors of different countries designated in Dhaka to hold discussion on FTA and sectoral discussions with the businessmen as well.

Standing committee on Capacity Building of Member Bodies

FBCCI will arrange training for its chambers and associations. FBCCI President Md. Jashim Uddin urged the trade bodies to make a list of the priority sectors need to increase capacity.

Federation Chief made the call at the first meeting of the standing committee on Capacity Building of member bodies held on June 27, 2022 at FBCCI.

President of FBCCI and Director-In-Charge of the Standing Committee Md. Jashim Uddin informed that FBCCI is going to set up Innovation Center to enhance the capacity of the private sector to deal with the challenges of post LDC, to achieve SDG-2030, Vision-2041 and other national development goals. Necessary trainings will be arranged for various chambers and sector based associations through this center.



FBCCI Senior Vice-President Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu said, most of the chambers have already done well in building capacity. The FBCCI will soon organize meetings with chamber and association leaders in all divisions to enhance the capacity of trade organizations.

Former First Vice-President of FBCCI and Chairman of the committee Mohammad Ali called for strengthening the secretariats of the trade organizations to make the organizations stronger and more dynamic.

Standing Committee on Jute and Jute Goods

Like the Export Development Fund, businessmen called for forming Jute Sector Development Fund which will facilitate the entrepreneurs with the loan at 2% interest.

They came up with this call at the first meeting of the standing committee on Jute and Jute Goods held at FBCCI on June 28, 2022. They said, this low-cost fund is now the only way to revive the country's jute sector.

The meeting also demanded withdrawal of 2% source tax on raw jute purchase and 10% on export incentives imposed in the budget, government initiative for permanent withdrawal of India's anti-dumping duty on jute products, bank loans waiver of private jute mills and initiatives to produce high yielding jute seeds.



Director In-Charge of the committee Mohammad Mahbubur Rahman Patwari said that this sector adds up to 200% value as both the industrial and agricultural product. Calling for withdrawal of advance income tax, he said, AIT hikes the price of jute goods.

Standing Committee on Relief and Rehabilitation

FBCCI conducts various corporate social responsibility programs in addition to providing leadership to private sector businesses. In continuation of this, the Federation has decided to distribute winter clothes to the winter prone areas of the country this year as well.

During the second meeting of the standing committee on relief and rehabilitation held on November 30, 2022 at FBCCI, Federation leaders informed about this decision to distribute winter clothes across the country through district chambers and associations. Speakers suggested giving priority to northern districts during distribution.

Chairing the meeting, FBCCI Senior Vice President Mr. Mostofa Azad Chowdhury Babu informed that several associations will also be provided winter clothes besides the district chamber in the distribution. He urged the FBCCI directors and the associations related to apparels come forward to help increase the area of winter clothing distribution.



FBCCI Vice President Md. Amin Helaly said the federation may not be able to distribute winter clothes to all the needy people of the country; the organization does not have that capability.

In addition to distribution of winter clothes among the cold hit people in the country, initiatives will also be taken to provide small amounts of cash, sewing machines and rickshaws to the very poor, said Director in-charge of the committee Mohammed Bazlur Rahman. He urged the businessmen to come forward in this regard.

Chairman of the committee Md. Abul Khair Morselin thanked the FBCCI Board of Directors for arranging the distribution of winter clothes across the country every year.

President of Bangladesh Economic Zone Investors' Association met FBCCI President

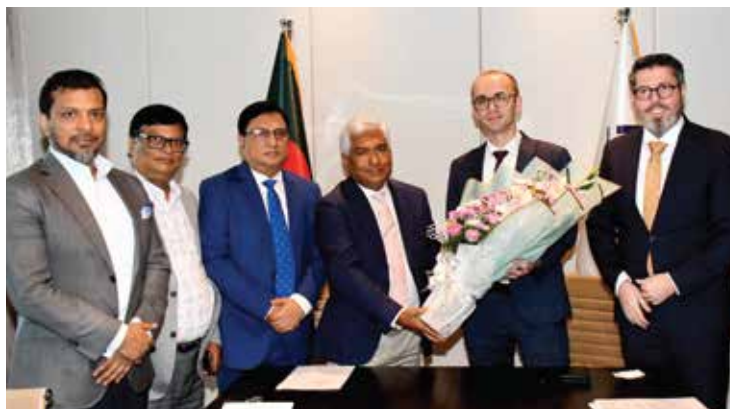

Brunei Halal Foods CEO Dr. Nur Rahman visited FBCCI

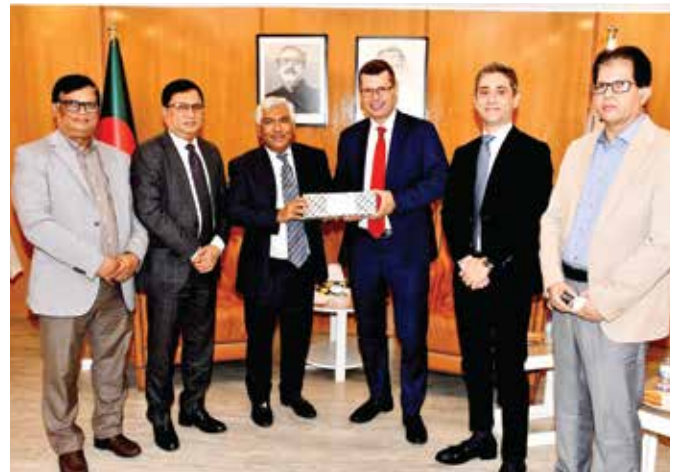

FBCCI urged the National Board of Revenue (NBR) vide letter dated November 29, 2022 to extend the timeframe for submitting income tax returns till December 31, 2022.

FBCCI made the request considering the current global economic situation and bigger challenges being faced by the industries, trade, and commerce as well as service sectors. FBCCI mentioned it would not be possible for many people to submit the returns within the stipulated timeframe of November 30 due to the existing situation in the financial sector.

It may be mentioned that NBR considered the plea of FBCCI and extended the time frame for submitting income tax returns till December 31, 2022.

FBCCI submitted recommendations to resolve the issues faced by the Non-Banking Financial Institutions (NBFIs)

FBCCI submitted a number of recommendations to Bangladesh Bank vide letter dated October 18, 2022 to resolve the issues faced by the Non-Banking Financial Institutions (NBFIs). FBCCI urged Bangladesh Bank to withdraw the cap on interest rate on deposit offered by NBFIs. It may be mentioned that Central Bank has imposed cap on interest/profit offered by NBFIs at 7.00% p.a. FBCCI also requested to form a Committee with representations from Bangladesh Bank, BLFCA, ABB, legal expert and chartered accountants to formulate a working plan for reconstruction of the distressed NBFIs.

FBCCI submitted recommendations on Proposed Public Audit Act

FBCCI submitted recommendations on Proposed Public Audit Act vide letter dated September 22, 2022 to Ministry of Finance. FBCCI has proposed to ensure that the private sector is exempted from the scope of this Act.

FBCCI submitted recommendations for the Bangladesh Bhutan Commerce Secretary level meeting (CSLM)

FBCCI submitted recommendations for the Bangladesh Bhutan Commerce Secretary level meeting (CSLM) vide letter dated September 8, 2022 to Ministry of Commerce. FBCCI urged that Bangladesh should proactively support the proposal for collaborations in the areas including recognition of certification schemes, research collaboration, facilitate testing and calibration services and to develop a joint project involving Bangladesh (BSTI), Bhutan (BSB) and Nepal (NBSM).

FBCCI proposed Agenda for 5th Bangladesh Japan Public Private Joint Economic Dialogue (PPED)

As per the request of Prime Minister's Office (PMO), FBCCI submitted proposed Agenda for the upcoming 5th Bangladesh Japan Public Private Joint Economic Dialogue (PPED) vide letter dated September 3, 2022.

FBCCI requested to include the issues related to establishment of Japan Bangladesh Comprehensive Economic Partnership through Joint Working Groups and extension of existing GSP Scheme and all support measures granted by Japan for a period of 3 (three) years after the graduation of Bangladesh from the least developed country category in 2026 in the Agenda of the PPED. FBCCI also proposed to take up sustainable mutual trade and investment facilitation measures, harmonization mutual trade regulations & facilitation measures and to set up internationally accredited sectoral standard certification facilities & common testing laboratories in each economic zone and cluster in Bangladesh.

FBCCI requested NBR to expedite faster clearance of industrial raw materials and machineries at Ports

FBCCI requested NBR to expedite faster clearing of industrial raw materials and machineries at ports vide

letter dated August 31, 2022. FBCCI mentioned that sometimes customs officials take much time to complete formalities of clearing industrial raw materials and machineries, which hampers production and disrupts supply chain. With a view to ensuring smooth production faster clearing of industrial raw materials and machineries should be speed up.

FBCCI submitted Proposals on Draft Trade (Import and Export) Management Act -2022

FBCCI submitted proposals on the Draft text on Trade (Import and Export) Management Act-2022 prepared by Ministry of Commerce vide letter dated August 30, 2022.

FBCCI proposed to rename the title ‘Trade (Import and Export) Management Act-2022’ as ‘Foreign Trade Management Act-2022’ as the objectives of the Act are related to expansion of foreign trade, sustainable development, modernization of import & export, controlling of import & export in the public interest, etc. FBCCI also proposed for a Board of the Directorate to execute the objectives of the Law led by the Commerce Secretary. Representatives of all concerned Ministries/ Departments including President of FBCCI will be the Members of the Board. Director General of the Directorate will be the member Secretary of the Board.

FBCCI urged to properly follow the Government Procurement Policy for maximum utilization of development expenditures

FBCCI urged to properly follow the Government Procurement Policy for maximum utilization of development expenditures vide letter dated August 29, 2022 to concerned Ministries.

FBCCI proposed to provide same facilities to foreign and local products/ services for public procurement. Country of origin or specific foreign brand name should not be mentioned while inviting bids for government procurement. FBCCI also mentioned that Bangladesh always allow same facilities to all countries to submit tenders for public procurement. Other countries also should give same facilities to Bangladesh.

FBCCI urged to issue circular on cash incentive for FY 2022-23

FBCCI urged to issue circular on cash incentive for FY 2022-23 vide letter dated August 29, 2022 to Ministry of Finance.

FBCCI mentioned that export incentives for 43 items of goods and services were announced for FY2021-2022 as a part of policy support for product diversification for export. The policy support helps to encourage the exporters. FBCCI requested to take necessary steps to issue the circular for cash incentive for the FY 2022-23.

FBCCI urged to expedite handing over land for BSCIC Plastic Shilpo Nogori (BSCIC Plastic Industrial Estate)

FBCCI urged to expedite handing over land for BSCIC Plastic Shilpo Nogori (BSCIC Plastic Industrial Estate) vide letter dated August 29, 2022 to Ministry of Industries. It has been mentioned that Plastic Industrial Estate with advanced facilities would help to grow compliant industries which will ultimately play important role for industrialization. FBCCI requested Ministry of Industries to expedite handing over 50 acre land at Sirajdikhan and 90 acre land at Chemical Industrial Park for BSCIC Plastic Shilpo Nogori as per the decision of ECNEC.

FBCCI submitted views on draft amendment to the Smoking and Tobacco Products Usage (Control) Act-2005 (Amended in 2013)

FBCCI submitted views on draft amendment text of the Smoking and Tobacco Products Usage (Control) Act-2005 (Amended in 2013) to Ministry of Health on August 28, 2022.

FBCCI addressed to waive the clauses of the draft amendment texts relating to compulsory trade license for tobacco product vendors and prohibition imposed on CSR activities carried out by Tobacco companies.

FBCCI urged NBR to withdraw the directive to share user IDs and Passwords of the accounting software from the Corporates

FBCCI urged NBR to withdraw the directive to share user IDs and Passwords of the accounting software from the Companies vide letter dated

August 17, 2022. FBCCI mentioned that the move caught the representatives of large companies off guard. By providing passwords of business account information, the privacy of the organizations cannot be protected and there are chances of the accounts being hacked. Meanwhile, there is no legal obligation for the companies to share ID and password to revenue authority as per the VAT Law and Audit Manual. So the directive should be withdrawn.

It may be mentioned that Large Taxpayers Unit (LTU-VAT) of NBR asked for round-the-clock access to the accounting software of companies paying large amounts of value-added tax (VAT). LTU sought the read-only user IDs and passwords of the accounting software from 111 entities by a directive on 3 August, 2022. They also warned the organizations of action if they do not provide the information within a week.

FBCCI submitted proposals on Draft National Export Trophy Policy-2022

FBCCI submitted proposals on the Draft National Export Trophy Policy -2022 prepared by Ministry of Commerce vide letter dated August 16, 2022. FBCCI proposed to include Printing, Packaging & Accessories, Cement, Iron & Steel, Cosmetics & Toiletries, Sanitary & Bathroom/ kitchen fittings for the export trophy. FBCCI also proposed for new category of export trophy for new export market.

FBCCI submitted opinion on Draft National Tax Card Policy 2022

FBCCI submitted opinion on Draft National Tax Card Policy 2022 to Ministry of Finance vide letter dated August 16, 2022. FBCCI has urged to have a legal basis for the tax card policy so that all concerned Departments are bound to provide facilities to the tax card holders as mentioned in the Policy. FBCCI also proposed to issue General Tax Card to all tax payees to acknowledge them and encourage others to pay tax.

FBCCI plead to readjust fuel prices by withdrawing taxes on petroleum products

FBCCI urged Hon'ble Prime Minister to readjust fuel prices by withdrawing taxes on petroleum products vide letter dated August 14, 2022.

It has been mentioned in the letter that the prices of fuel, including diesel, kerosene, octane and petrol, have recently been raised by 47 per cent on an average. The fuel price hikes would create further pressure for the economy, as these will increase the cost of goods' production and transportation and eventually the local businesses will lose competitiveness in the global market, the letter read. So, steps should be taken immediately to bring energy prices down to the people's purchasing capacity by withdrawing taxes and duties imposed on the products.

It may be mentioned here that considering the plea of FBCCI, Government brought down the diesel price recently following reducing the import duty and waiving advance tax from import of fuel.

FBCCI urged to withdraw suspension of collecting stones in Sylhet

FBCCI urged to withdraw suspension of collecting stones from the stone quarries in Sylhet District vide letter dated August 14, 2022 to Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources.

It may be mentioned that the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources in an order placed an embargo on collection of stones in all quarries of Sylhet. With this suspension of stone collection including both manual and mechanical ones, over five lakh workers have become jobless. Their family members are to now passing their days with much hardship. The suspension is also hampering the development works.

Recently, the quarries in Sylhet become full of stone due to heavy rain and flood. Considering the situation, FBCCI urged the Government to withdraw suspension of collecting stones from the stone quarries in Sylhet.

FBCCI sought economic-recovery policy support from Bangladesh Bank in the context of prevailing situation of Covid and Ukraine crisis

FBCCI submitted a set of recommendations to Bangladesh Bank for policy support considering economic recovery realities of the country in the context of prevailing situation of Covid and Ukraine crisis. A FBCCI Business Delegation led by its President Mr. Md. Jashim Uddin met Governor of Bangladesh Bank on May 31, 2022 and placed the

proposals. FBCCI President expressed thanks and gratitude to Governor of Bangladesh Bank for their continued support to facilitate economic activities during the prevailing Covid situation.

FBCCI President mentioned that the Russia-Ukraine crisis in the time of Covid-19 pandemic almost takes the global economy into another spell of recession enhancing business costs through badly affecting global supply chains. Under such circumstances, many buyers are making deferred payments that severely affect the local industries.

Global price hike of raw materials and machineries and increasing cost of transportation and shipment are mounting the cost of doing business. In this context some emergency Banking support are required to uphold the competitiveness of Bangladeshi products. Following Proposals were made by FBCCI:

- Loan-repayment moratorium till December' 2022 because of volatile business ambience globally amid the Covid and Ukraine crisis. This step would help to keep the overall business activities as usual.
- Enhancement of the size of export development fund (EDF) to US\$10 billion from the existing \$7.0 billion in considering factors like growing cost of raw materials and the prevailing trade situation.
- To create the refinancing scheme with a certain amount of funds for long-term financing because using short-term deposits of the banks for industrial purposes is not viable for business. The support is very much needed to industries especially in post-LDC-graduation period.
- To increase the Single Borrower Exposure Limit from 25% to 35% to keep the supply chain normal.
- Extension of stimulus loan repayment time.
- Raising the cash incentives to 4% from existing 2.5% to encourage the expatriate Bangladeshis to send their hard-earned foreign currencies through the formal channels. FBCCI also proposed to remove the limit of Tk. 1 crore for investment in Wage Earner's Development Bond.
- Resumption of loan- rescheduling facility with 2.0-per cent down payment of loans for sectors badly affected by the pandemic. Sectors like Transport, Cold storage etc. may be specially considered for the loan rescheduling facility.
- Prevailing difficulties for payment of cash incentive of jute sector may be resolved.
- If one company has problem with CIB, other companies with common Directors can't operate. It severely affects businesses and other companies also

become sick. Other companies which have clean CIB should be allowed to operate as usual.

- Development partners are funding for the development of the country. Previously all international bidders used to participate in the tender alone. Now Bangladeshi companies have the capacity to attend the international bid. But Bangladeshi companies need to make strategic alliances with foreign companies to qualify. For issuance of Bid bond and performance guarantee relaxation to be made in case of foreign remittances. Bangladesh Bank may allow 10 to 20% cash margins in form of foreign currency to issue the Bid bond and performance Guarantee. If it is done all the foreign currencies funded by the development partners (WB, ADB etc) will remain in Bangladesh and our reserve will be increased.

FBCCI urged to postpone the process for increasing prices of electricity and gas

FBCCI urged the government to postpone the process for increasing prices of electricity and gas. FBCCI President made the appeal at a press conference held at the FBCCI on May 21, 2022. Formal letters were also sent to Power & Energy Advisor of Hon'ble Prime Minister, Hon'ble State Minister for Power, Energy and Natural Resources, Principal Secretary to Hon'ble Prime Minister and other concerned.

FBCCI also submitted a set of recommendations for further development of power and energy sector of the country.

FBCCI mentioned that the COVID-19 pandemic and Russia-Ukraine war raised the price of raw materials in international market, and businesses have to pay extra cost for shipping and transportation. Besides, the cost of doing business is already high in the country and thus, it is becoming difficult to remain competitive for the export-oriented sector. So it is not the right time to raise the power and gas prices. It would be suicidal for the economy.

FBCCI also underscored that the current world situation hits the oil market and based on this temporary trend, government should not increase the price of the power, rather, mitigate the challenge with Energy Fund. The hike in the price of power and energy would create multidimensional inflation which would have a negative impact on the lives of the people and would seriously wound the ongoing

flow of development.

FBCCI suggested instead of raising the prices, the government should carry out necessary reform for further development of the power and energy sector. Steps should be taken to cut illegal connections and lower the unnecessary expenditures. FBCCI also urged for preparing short term and long term roadmap for ensuring cheap, uninterrupted and sustainable electricity to attain the SDG-7.

FBCCI Submitted Proposals on Draft Income Tax Law prepared by NBR

FBCCI submitted its proposals on Draft Income Tax Law to NBR on February 8, 2022. In its proposals, FBCCI mentioned that the basic aspects of income tax law must be in line with international best practices and the country's investment needs, to formulate a timely income tax law. FBCCI also urged to take measures to increase the revenue by expanding the net of income tax. FBCCI proposed to set up income tax offices at all Upazila levels to increase revenue and tax-to-GDP ratio. Income tax should be levied only on the income of a taxable entity. It should not be imposed on transactions, sales or receipts.

FBCCI emphasized on Standard Operating Procedure and applicable rules for carrying out all related activities in a transparent and easy manner by incorporating the provisions of the tax and digitalization based source tax activities, income tax return filing, audit selection, tax assessment, appeal and refund process, etc. into the law.

FBCCI's proposals have been formulated in light of the recommendations of the Sub Committee formed to formulate proposals on draft Income Tax Law and consultation with its Members Bodies and stakeholders.

FBCCI Submitted Proposals on Industrial Policy -2021

FBCCI submitted its proposals on next Industrial Policy 2021 to Ministry of Industries on January 29, 2022. FBCCI has urged to have a legal basis for the upcoming National Industrial Policy to be formulated by the Government.

In its proposals, FBCCI mentioned that due to lack

of the legal entities, entrepreneurs are not able to take advantage of the benefits of the current industry policy. As a result, both local and foreign investment is being hampered. Coordination among concerned Ministries is essential for the implementation of industrial policy under a legal format.

FBCCI's proposals have been formulated in light of the recommendations of FBCCI Standing Committee on Industry and Industrial Policy and consultation with its Members Bodies and stakeholders.

FBCCI urged to increase the limit for Working Capital Loan

FBCCI urged to increase the limit for working capital loan by minimum 40 per cent from the existing level - to help businessmen offset price hike of raw materials in the international market along with increased freight costs. FBCCI placed the submission to the Bangladesh Bank on March 30, 2022

FBCCI mentioned that the pandemic situation still exists in different parts of the world which is affecting the trade and economic activities of the country. In addition, due to the situation in Russia and Ukraine, the prices of raw materials in the international market and shipping costs are increasing constantly. So it is necessary to increase the limit of working capital loan for the businesses. According to the plea of FBCCI, Bangladesh Bank has directed Banks to lift the limit of working capital loans to keep business activities dynamic and ensure additional money supply as the cost of raw materials in the international market and transportation has increased.

FBCCI submitted comments on draft Regulations on Submission of Financial Report and draft Rules on Fine & Administrative Fine to FRC

FBCCI submitted comments on draft Regulations on Submission of Financial Report and draft Rules on Fine & Administrative Fine to Financial Reporting Council (FRC) on February 23, 2022 and March 27, 2022.

In its proposals FBCCI has urged to amend the definition of Public Interest Company (Jonoshartha Sontha). FBCCI proposed to enhance the

minimum limit of the annual revenue to Tk. 300 Cr. to submit financial report to FRC. FBCCI mentioned that according to FRC Circular No. 169 dt March 11, 2020, if the annual revenue is fixed Tk. 5 crore to submit financial report, millions of traders including SMEs need to be listed as public Interest company, which is totally unimaginable, unrealistic and unnecessary.

FBCCI submitted Budget proposals for FY 2022-23

FBCCI submitted Budget proposals for FY 2022-23 to the Government. The Budget proposals have been formally placed at the 42nd Consultative Committee Meeting of NBR organized jointly by NBR and FBCCI on March 22, 2022. Hon'ble Finance Minister was present in the meeting as Chief Guest.

FBCCI's budget proposals have been prepared on the basis of opinion received from its Member Bodies. A number of meetings of Standing Committee on Budget, Sub Committees on VAT, Customs Duty & Income Tax were held to finalize the proposals.

In its Budget proposals, FBCCI emphasized on reduction of cost of doing business, infrastructural development, investment protection, increasing port capacity, ensuring balanced investment-friendly tax management, reducing transportation costs including shipping, electricity and fuel, etc to prepare the upcoming Budget.

FBCCI also proposed to ensure efficiency, transparency and accountability in budget implementation. FBCCI proposed to increase the amount of revenue by reducing the tax rate by expanding the net of income tax and VAT, separation of revenue policy activities from revenue collection and withdrawal of advance income tax (AIT) and advance tax (AT) levied on all industrial materials including imported raw materials, intermediate raw materials.

FBCCI also proposed for uninterrupted and same facilities for all export sectors, and integration into the global supply chain. It was also proposed to implement investment-friendly and productive product-based customs duty for all segments, including importers, micro, small, medium, women and new industrial entrepreneurs. Income tax should be levied only on the income of a taxable entity.

FBCCI viewed that all related activities should be performed in a transparent and easy manner by incorporating the provisions of IT and digitalization based source tax activities, filing income tax returns, audit selection, tax assessment, appeal and refund process into law. FBCCI also urged to keep the prices of daily necessities at a tolerable level in the context of upcoming Holy Ramadan ensuring more strengthening of Government's monitoring system.

FBCCI Submitted Proposals on FDI Policy

FBCCI submitted its recommendations on Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) Policy-2022 to BIDA on March 5, 2022. In its proposals, FBCCI emphasized on among others, one stop service, easing business registration requirements, streamlining administrative procedures to quicken and to reduce the cost of establishing new investment, ensuring post-investment facilitation, business friendly law, regulations, administrative policy reform, investment financing with low transaction cost, cost effective quality power & energy, quality of available humane capital, trade facilitation, capacity of ports, etc.

FBCCI submitted recommendations on Draft National Pension Authority Act-2022

FBCCI submitted its recommendations on Draft National Pension Authority Act-2022 to Ministry of Finance on April 24, 2022. FBCCI proposed that Bangladeshi citizens aged 18 to 65 years should participate under the pension scheme on the basis of national identity card. It was also proposed that the contributors should be guaranteed to receive their pension within 30 working days of retirement and the voluntary retirees within 45 working days of retirement.

Recommendations of FBCCI to the Governor of Bangladesh Bank in the prevailing business and economic situation

FBCCI submitted a set of recommendations to the Governor of Bangladesh Bank on December 12, 2022 to face the present challenges due to global economic crisis. FBCCI President met Governor of Bangladesh Bank and submitted the proposals. In its recommendations, FBCCI mentioned that to meet the challenges of the Covid situation and the

ongoing global economic crisis, Bangladesh Bank has provided incentives and policy support to various industries and service sectors as per the situation. These assistances have played a very important role in keeping the country's economic activities going.

Presently, due to the Russia-Ukraine situation, the price of raw materials, shipping charges and fuel costs are constantly increasing in the international market. The increase in raw material, shipping and other costs has adversely affected the country's international trade. In addition, due to the exchange rate of foreign currency and the increase in the price of goods in the international market and the dollar crisis, there is a huge economic pressure on the businessmen.

In this situation, it has become challenging for businessmen to conduct economic activities normally. In this context, following proposals may be considered to overcome the existing crisis:

- With a view to ensure dollar supply for easy LC opening for import of capital machinery, parts

and industrial raw materials Deferred Payment, Usance LC etc. may be continued. Same exchange rate of dollar for imports and exports and different exchange rate for remittances may be followed. Incentives for remittances may also be considered. Steps may be taken to follow the local currency exchange (SWAP) system in the case of imports at the government level (G to G). Any inward remittance through banking channel may be facilitated.

- In order to maintain the desired investment and employment, loan classification facility should be extended until June 30, 2023.

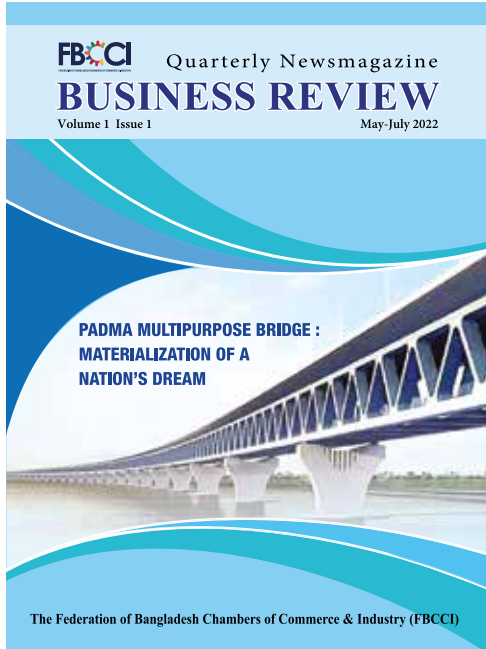
- It is important to maintain interest rates in single digits in the prevailing crisis situation. Otherwise the cost of doing business will increase which will create more challenges in the manufacturing and export sector. Also investment, industrialization and employment will be hindered. In this context, interest rate capping should be continued.

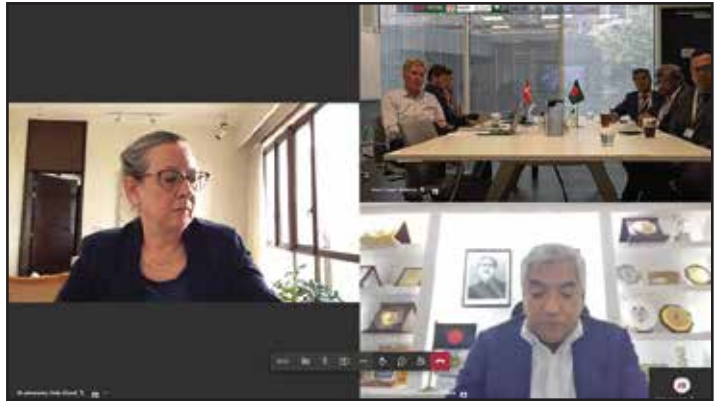

2.00 Accounting basis & accounting policies

2.01 Accounting basis

The Financial Statements have been prepared and presented fairly in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) and International Accounting Standards (IAS), the Companies act 1994.

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with following accounting standards.

IAS 01, IFRS- Presentation of Financial Statements

IAS 08- Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimation and Errors

IAS 16- Property, Plant and Equipments

IAS 21- The Effects of Changes in Foreign Exchange Rates

IAS 23- Borrowing Cost

IFRS 7, IFRS 9- Financial Instruments: Recognition & Measurements

The following IAS/IFRS were not fully complied in the Financial Statements as per previous practice:

IAS 37 No Provision for Gratuity was considered in the accounts.

IAS 12 No deferred tax calculation has been considered in the accounts.

IAS 16 Depreciation on addition of fixed asset was charged for full year instead of charging from the date of installing the asset for its intended use.

IAS 07 No cash flows statements has been prepared. However statement of receipt payments has been provided in the account.

Management is considering to implement the above IAS fully in future.

2.02 Income Tax and VAT

Matters relating to Income Tax and VAT have been dealt with according to provision of the Income Tax Ordinance (ITO) 1984 and VAT & SD Act 2012. As per SRO-210/IT 2012 our income except bank interest is exempted from Tax.

2.03 Revenue recognition

All income and expenses are accounted for on accrual basis.

2.04 Fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are stated at net book value:

Depreciation on Fixed assets is charged on reducing balance method at rates ranging from 2.5% to 20% per annum depending on the estimated life of assets. Full year depreciations charged on the additions to fixed assets irrespective of the date of acquisition thereof.

2.05 Employees benefits-gratuity

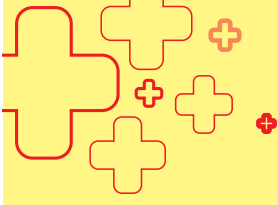

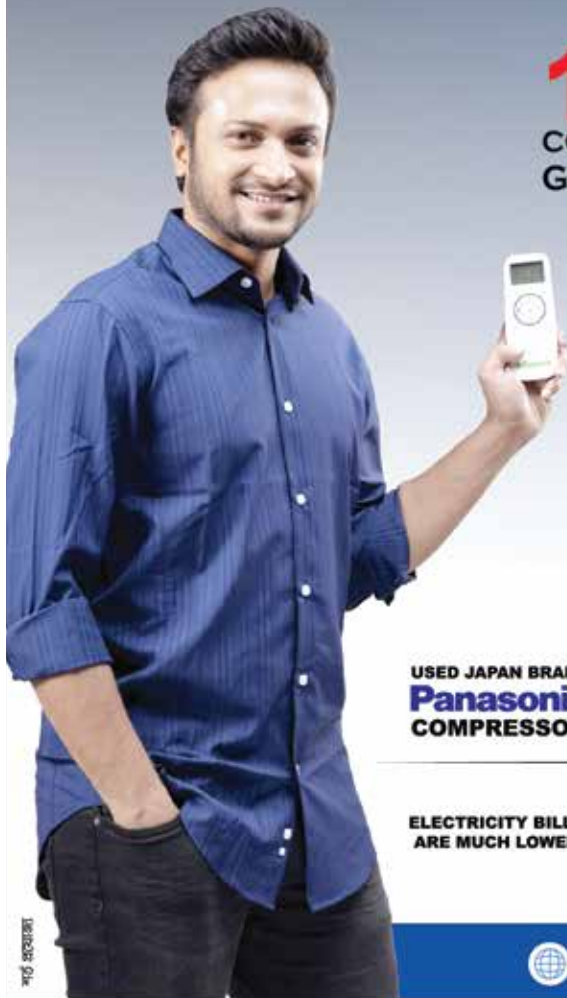
